
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO APPRENTICESHIPS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that apprenticeship
2 programs are age-old, successful models for developing skilled
3 workers. Apprenticeship programs approved by University of
4 Hawaii community colleges are composed of two major components:
5 work process and related instruction. The work process
6 component consists of on-the-job training, while the related
7 instruction component is the structured class and laboratory or
8 shop curricula. Therefore, apprenticeship programs develop job
9 skills through both theoretical and practical experiences.
10 Furthermore, the associate degree provides alignment with
11 completion of an approved apprenticeship program.

12 The legislature also finds that in 2016, the United States
13 Department of Labor, Employment and Training Administration,
14 awarded the department of labor and industrial relations a
15 \$1,167,291 grant to expand apprenticeship opportunities in
16 information technology and health care. This grant helped to



1 alleviate the shortage of community health workers, pharmacy
2 technicians, and optometry assistants.

3 Research and peer-reviewed studies focusing on the role of
4 community health workers have overwhelmingly documented the
5 positive support of community health workers as part of a
6 professional health care team. In addition, community health
7 workers increasingly have become team members in providing
8 services that help reduce the number of homeless individuals in
9 Hawaii.

10 The purpose of this Act is to provide funding to continue
11 and expand health care apprenticeship programs at the University
12 of Hawaii community colleges.

13 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for health
16 care apprenticeship programs at community colleges.

17 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of
18 Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

19 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
