A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATED TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended by adding a new section to part XII to be appropriately
4	designated and to read as follows:
5	"§291C- Mauna Kea and Waipio valley access; required
6	four-wheel drive vehicle use. (a) No vehicle, other than a
7	low-range, four-wheel drive vehicle, shall at any time be driver
8	through or in the connecting roadway corridor between the Waipio
9	valley lookout and the floor of Waipio valley or the connecting
10	roadway corridor between Hale Pohaku and the Mauna Kea science
11	reserve; provided that any vehicle may be driven in these areas
12	<u>if:</u>
13	(1) It is in the process of executing a legal turn, lane
14	change, or parking maneuver to exit the area;
15	(2) It is an authorized emergency vehicle performing the
16	functions under section 291C-26;

1	<u>(3)</u>	It is an official federal, state, or county vehicle in	
2		the performance of its actual duty;	
3	(4)	It is necessary to assist a stalled or broken vehicle;	
4	(5)	It is necessary to yield to an authorized emergency	
5		vehicle pursuant to section 291C-65;	
6	<u>(6)</u>	It is a vehicle engaged in or in support of research	
7		or maintenance activities; or	
8	(7)	It is otherwise provided by law.	
9	(b)	Violation of this section shall subject the driver of	
10	the vehicle to a fine of \$250.		
11	For	purposes of this section, an all-wheel drive vehicle	
12	shall not	be considered to be a low-range, four-wheel drive	
13	vehicle."		
14		PART II	
15	SECT	ION 2. The legislature finds that the Hawaii Revised	
16	Statutes	imposes a state motor vehicle weight tax for various	
17	types of	vehicles and authorizes the counties to impose their	
18	own motor vehicle weight tax.		
19	The	legislature finds that residents with a disability who	
20	purchase	or retrofit a non-commercial vehicle with a lift or	
21	ramp desi	gned to provide ingress and egress in the vehicle by	

- 1 the person with disability pay more in state and county motor
- 2 vehicle weight taxes in comparison to residents with non-
- 3 modified vehicles. The extra weight of the vehicle is due to
- 4 the lifts and ramps, any required motors, and additional
- 5 reinforcement of the vehicle chassis.
- 6 The purpose of this part is to exempt the weight of any
- 7 lifts or ramps installed to assist a person with a disability on
- 8 a non-commercial vehicle for purposes of computing annual state
- 9 and county motor vehicle weight taxes.
- 10 SECTION 3. Section 249-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by amending the definition of "net weight" to read as
- 12 follows:
- ""Net weight" of a vehicle means the actual weight of the
- 14 vehicle, as determined on a standard scale, including all
- 15 equipment and accessories ordinarily attached to and used on the
- 16 vehicle and, in the case of a motor vehicle, the maximum fuel,
- 17 oil, and water possible of being carried for its operation;
- 18 provided that "net weight" of a new standard equipped vehicle,
- 19 other than a motor vehicle, means the shipping weight thereof as
- 20 established by its manufacturer, and "net weight" of a new
- 21 standard equipped passenger vehicle means the shipping weight

1 thereof as established by its manufacturer, plus one hundred 2 pounds, and "net weight" of a new standard equipped motorcycle, 3 motor scooter, or moped, means the shipping weight thereof as 4 established by its manufacturer, plus thirty pounds, and "net 5 weight" of a new standard equipped truck means the shipping 6 weight thereof as established by its manufacturer, plus two 7 hundred pounds. On initial registration of a standard equipped 8 vehicle, other than a motor vehicle, for which the director of 9 finance has the manufacturer's established weight, the director 10 of finance, in lieu of requiring the vehicle to be weighed and 11 in order to determine the "net weight" thereof, may use such 12 established weight and may require the owner to furnish 13 verification of the factory serial number of the vehicle. 14 initial registration of standard equipped passenger vehicles, 15 motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and trucks for which the 16 director of finance has the manufacturer's established weights, 17 the director of finance, in lieu of requiring such motor 18 vehicles to be weighed and in order to determine the "net weight" thereof, may use such established weights, adding one 19 20 hundred pounds in the case of standard equipped passenger 21 vehicles, thirty pounds in the case of standard equipped

- 1 motorcycles, motor scooters, and mopeds, and two hundred pounds 2 in the case of standard equipped trucks, and may require the owners to furnish verification of factory serial and engine 3 4 numbers of such motor vehicles. As to a vehicle for which the 5 manufacturer's weight is not available or whose make and model 6 cannot be determined with reasonable certainty or which has been 7 so altered as to increase or diminish the weight thereof, "net 8 weight" means the actual weight of such vehicle, as determined 9 on a standard scale, including all equipment and accessories 10 ordinarily attached to and used on the vehicle and, in the case of a motor vehicle, the maximum fuel, oil, and water possible of 11 12 being carried for its operation. Notwithstanding the foregoing 13 provisions, for all non-commercial vehicles, the weight of any 14 vehicle modifications made to assist a person with a disability **15** to enter or exit the vehicle, including but not limited to 16 lifts, ramps, motors to power lifts or ramps, and chassis 17 reinforcements, shall be excluded from the determination of the 18 vehicle's net weight. In all cases information shall be 19 presented to and in the manner prescribed by the director of 20 finance."

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.

Report Title:

Waipio Valley; Mauna Kea; Roadway; Four-wheel Drive Vehicles; Motor Vehicle Weight Tax; Exemption for Lifts and Ramps

Description:

Prohibits any vehicle, except a low-range, four-wheel drive vehicle, from being driven through or in Waipio Valley or the Mauna Kea Science Reserve, except under certain circumstances. Excludes the weight of disability access modifications from the determination of net weight for non-commercial vehicles for purposes of levying the state and county motor vehicle weight tax. Effective date of 1/1/2100. (SD1)
