A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that schools have a
- 2 responsibility to prepare students for success in a globally
- 3 competitive world.
- 4 During the 2013-2014 school year, the legislature
- 5 appropriated \$8,200,000 to the department of education to
- 6 implement the access learning pilot program. In 2013, teachers
- 7 in eight schools were provided laptop computers and professional
- 8 development opportunities to assist in integrating technology
- 9 into their classrooms. In 2014, laptop computers were provided
- 10 to students. A study of the pilot program by the University of
- 11 Hawaii at West Oahu found that teachers, students, and parents
- 12 believed that classroom technology significantly enhanced the
- 13 quality of public education in Hawaii.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to ensure
- 15 that students have fair access to technology in all public
- 16 schools.

- 1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for laptop
- 4 computers or tablets, as deemed necessary by the department of
- 5 education, to be used by teachers and students for digital
- 6 teaching and learning.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 8 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
