A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that, according to the SECTION 1. 2 Environmental Protection Agency's 2016 Underground Injection 3 Well Inventory, Hawaii has over six thousand six hundred 4 injection wells. The Environmental Protection Agency recognizes 5 an injection well as a method to place fluid underground into porous geologic formations and that it has a wide range of uses, 6 7 including storing carbon dioxide and disposing of waste. Some 8 of the injection wells in the State can possibly harm the nearby 9 local environment.

10 Researchers from the University of Hawaii at Manoa used 11 field experiments and chemical analysis of water and algae in Maui to establish a connection between coastal groundwater and 12 13 the health of nearshore ecosystems. The results were detailed and published on November 3, 2016, in the study "Impact of 14 15 Submarine Groundwater Discharge on Marine Water Quality and Reef Biota of Maui" and showed a large impact that the wastewater 16 17 injection wells at the Kahului Wastewater Reclamation Facility



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1	have had on Kahului Bay. The study highlighted that there were
2	relatively high nutrient levels in marine surface waters in
3	Kahului Bay and shallow areas were almost entirely dominated by
4	a thick fleshy mat of colonial zoanthids, a phenomenon not
5	reported anywhere else in the State.
6	Injection wells can be hazardous to the environment and
7	pose a risk to the health and safety of the public.
8	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to prohibit the
9	construction of sewage wastewater injection wells.
10	SECTION 2. Chapter 342D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
12	and to read as follows:
13	" <u>§342D-</u> Injection wells prohibited. (a) No approval
14	for the construction of a sewage wastewater injection well shall
15	be issued by the department, unless alternative wastewater
16	disposal options are not available, feasible, or practical.
17	(b) As used in this section, "injection well" means a
18	bored, drilled, or driven shaft, or a dug hole, whose depth is
19	greater than its widest surface dimension into which subsurface
20	disposal of fluid or fluids occurs or is intended to occur by
21	means of injection."



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1	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
2	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
3	begun before its effective date.
4	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
5	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 28, 2045.
