A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's natural 2 environment and ecosystems are in a fragile state due to the 3 amount of greenhouse gases released through human activities and 4 the resulting impact on global climate change. The legislature 5 also finds that the State should support programs that incentivize state agencies, private entities, and individuals to 6 7 adopt practices that are more environmentally friendly and that 8 result in reduced carbon emissions into the environment. 9 legislature notes that one mechanism that has gained success in 10 Europe after adoption of the Kyoto Protocol is the transferring 11 and selling of carbon offset credits. California and numerous 12 other states and private industries have established these types 13 of credits for purchase by polluters to offset their carbon 14 emissions. Billions of dollars have been raised by California 15 alone, and many industries are seeking new places to invest 16 these dollars to offset their carbon emissions.

1 The legislature further finds that it is necessary to 2 invest state funds to improve the State's water infrastructure 3 and ensure future water sustainability in the face of ongoing 4 climate change. More specifically, the State must be prepared 5 to provide more resources and support for those affected by disaster-scale flooding, coastal seawater inundation, and 6 7 shortages of potable water and agricultural water. The 8 legislature anticipates that the revenues raised by a state 9 carbon offset program will greatly enhance current water 10 sustainability efforts. 11 Accordingly, the legislature finds that it is in the public **12** interest to create a carbon offset program in the State that **13** would incentivize and reward the adoption of, practice of, and 14 adherence to carbon emission reduction activities, consistent 15 with the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan. 16 The purpose of this Act is to establish a carbon offset 17 program under the department of business, economic development, 18 and tourism, in partnership with the department of land and natural resources, through which revenues realized from the sale 19 20 of carbon offset credits may be deposited into the forest 21 stewardship fund or invested into projects that improve the

3	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended b	y adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
5	designate	d and to read as follows:
6	" <u>§20</u>	1- Carbon offset program. (a) In partnership with
7	the depar	tment of land and natural resources, the department
8	shall est	ablish a carbon offset program that:
9	(1)	Provides expertise in carbon offsetting to public
10		agencies and private entities and assists in
11		coordinating carbon offset projects of public
12		agencies, including but not limited to the generation,
13		certification, and marketing of carbon credits;
14	(2)	Allows for proceeds and revenues generated by the
15		department of land and natural resources from sales of
16		forest carbon offset credits to be deposited into the
17		forest stewardship fund pursuant to section 194F-4;
18		provided that the funds are used in accordance with
19		the purposes of the fund;
20	(3)	Allows for proceeds and revenues generated by state
21		agencies from sales of carbon credits other than as

1		described in paragraph (2) to be invested in projects
2		enhancing the State's efforts to mitigate climate
3		change, improving the State's water infrastructure, or
4		mitigating threats to water sustainability due to
5		climate change, including but not limited to:
6		(A) Flood prevention and preparedness;
7		(B) Mitigation of sea level rise;
8		(C) Increasing potable water supplies;
9		(D) Increasing agricultural water supplies; and
10		(E) Watershed restoration or protection;
11	(4)	Provides environmental, social, cultural, or economic
12		benefits, including but not limited to the improvement
13		of the State's water infrastructure or mitigation of
14		threats to water sustainability due to climate change;
15		and
16	<u>(5)</u>	Is consistent with the State's sustainability goals
17		and policies.
18	(b)	The department, in partnership with the department of
19	land and	natural resources, shall adopt rules, pursuant to
20	chapter 9	1, necessary to carry out the purposes of this section.
21	(c)	As used in this section:

1	"Carbon credit" means a tradable certificate or permit
2	issued by a carbon registry that represents a greenhouse gas
3	reduction or greenhouse gas removal enhancement that is
4	equivalent to one metric ton of carbon dioxide and meets the
5	requirements of the program.
6	"Carbon offset" means a compensatory measure made by an
7	agency, business, or individual to reduce carbon dioxide
8	emissions or to increase carbon dioxide sequestration.
9	"Carbon registry" means any established international,
10	national, or regional carbon registry program that serves
11	voluntary or compliance markets, provides an independent carbon
12	standard to verify and certify carbon offsets, and issues carbon
13	credits.
14	"Forest carbon offset" means a compensatory measure made by
15	an agency, business, or individual to increase carbon dioxide
16	sequestration through the withdrawal from the atmosphere and
17	storage of carbon dioxide in biomass within forest areas.
18	"Program" means the carbon offset program administered by
19	the department in partnership with the department of land and
20	natural resources.

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- 1 "Public agency" means a unit of state, city, or county
- 2 government.
- 3 "State agency" means a unit of state government, such as a
- 4 department, division, branch, agency, program, or office, and
- 5 includes the legislature, judiciary, and office of Hawaiian
- 6 affairs."
- 7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to
- 10 implement the credit offset program.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 13 this Act.
- 14 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 28, 2045.

Description:

Establishes a carbon offset program under the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, in partnership with the Department of Land and Natural Resources. Allows the proceeds and revenue generated from forest carbon offset credits to be deposited into the forest stewardship fund, and non-forest carbon credits to be invested in projects enhancing the State's efforts to mitigate climate change, improving the State's water infrastructure, or mitigating threats to water sustainability efforts due to climate change. Appropriates funds to implement the carbon offset program. Takes effect on 1/28/2045. (SD1)

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
