### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUSINESS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 428, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§428-</u> <u>Low-profit limited liability company.</u> (a) A
5	low-profit limited liability company shall at all times
6	significantly further the accomplishment of one or more
7	charitable or educational purposes within the meaning of section
8	170(c)(2)(B) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, title 26
9	United States Code section 170(c)(2)(B), or its successor
10	provision, and would not have been formed but for the
11	relationship to the accomplishment of such charitable or
12	educational purposes.
13	(b) A limited liability company that intends to qualify as
14	a low-profit limited liability company pursuant to this section

shall so indicate in its articles of organization and shall

further state that:

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1	<u>(1)</u>	No significant purpose of the company is the
2		production of income or the appreciation of property;
3		provided that the fact that the company actually
4		produces significant income or capital appreciation
5		shall not, in the absence of other factors, be
6		conclusive evidence of a significant purpose involving
7		the production of income or the appreciation of
8		property; and
9	(2)	No purpose of the company is to accomplish one or more
10		political or legislative purposes within the meaning
11		of section 170(c)(2)(D) of the Internal Revenue Code
12		of 1986, title 26 United States Code section
13		170(c)(2)(D), or its successor provision.
14	<u>(c)</u>	A company that no longer satisfies the requirements of
15	this sect	ion shall continue to exist as a limited liability
16	company a	and shall promptly amend its articles of organization so
17	that its	name and purpose no longer identify it as a low-profit
18	limited 1	iability company or L3C.
19	(d)	Any company operating or holding itself out as a low-
20	profit li	mited liability company in this State, any company
21	formed as	s a low-profit limited liability company pursuant to

- 1 this section, and any chief operating officer, director, or
- 2 manager of any such company shall be a fiduciary subject to
- 3 chapter 556, the uniform fiduciaries act.
- 4 (e) Nothing in this section shall prevent a limited
- 5 liability company that is not organized as a low-profit limited
- 6 liability company from electing a charitable or educational
- 7 purpose in whole or in part for doing business under this
- 8 chapter."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 428-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 11 and to read as follows:
- ""Low-profit limited liability company" or "L3C" means a
- 13 for-profit limited liability company that satisfies the
- 14 requirements of section 428- and does not have as a
- 15 significant purpose the production of income or the appreciation
- 16 of property."
- 17 SECTION 3. Section 428-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 19 "(b) The operating agreement may not:
- 20 (1) Unreasonably restrict a right to information or access
- 21 to records under section 428-408;

1	(2)	Eliminate the duty of loyalty under section 428-409(b)
2		or 428-603(b)(3), but the agreement may:
3		(A) Identify specific types or categories of
4		activities that do not violate the duty of
5		loyalty, if not manifestly unreasonable; and

9		facts, a specific act or transaction that
10		otherwise would violate the duty of loyalty;
11	(3)	Unreasonably reduce the duty of care under section
12		428-409(c) or 428-603(b)(3);
13	(4)	Eliminate the obligation of good faith and fair
14		dealing under section 428-409(d), but the operating
15		agreement may determine the standards by which the
16		performance of the obligation is to be measured, if
17		the standards are not manifestly unreasonable;
18	(5)	Vary the right to expel a member in an event specified
10		in section 428-601(5):

1	(6)	Vary the requirement to wind up the limited liability
2		company's business in a case specified in section 428-
3		801(3) or 428-801(4); [ <del>or</del> ]
4	(7)	Restrict rights of third parties under this chapter,
5		other than managers, members, or their transferees[ $\div$ ]
6		<u>or</u>
7	(8)	Eliminate or reduce the obligations or purposes
8		undertaken by a low-profit limited liability company
9		organized pursuant to section 428"
10	SECT	ION 4. Section 428-105, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
12	"(a)	The name of a [ <del>limited</del> ]:
13	(1)	<u>Limited</u> liability company must contain "limited
14		liability company" or the abbreviation "L.L.C." or
15		"LLC"[-]; and
16	(2)	Low-profit limited liability company must contain
17		"low-profit limited liability company" or the
18		abbreviation "L3C".
19	"Lim	ited" may be abbreviated as "Ltd.", and "company" may
20	be abbrev	iated as "Co.". The letters in the name of a limited

- 1 liability company, other than the abbreviation "L3C", must be
- 2 letters of the English alphabet."

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- 3 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
