## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that an educated state
workforce will help to increase government efficiency, provide
quality services to the public, reduce waste, and promote
innovative ideas statewide. The legislature also finds that
providing incentives for individuals to further their education
as state employees will enhance the State's ability to improve
government services.

8 The legislature declares that providing tuition grants for 9 certain individuals to attend post-secondary or professional 10 degree programs at the University of Hawaii system in exchange 11 for commitment to public service is a matter of statewide 12 concern.

13 The purpose of this Act is to provide tuition grants for14 state employees who commit to employment with the State.

15 SECTION 2. Chapter 78, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 16 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 17 read as follows:

2	employees	(a) The department of human resources development
3	shall prov	vide grants to fund the tuition of any person who
4	applies fo	or a grant under this section; provided that the

6	(1)	The person is a United States citizen or an eligible
7		noncitizen;
8	(2)	The person is a current employee of the State;
9	(3)	The person is admitted to and enrolled in an
10		undergraduate, graduate, or professional degree
11		program, or community college program, of the
12		University of Hawaii;
13	(4)	The person maintains satisfactory academic progress,
14		as determined by the educational program that the
15		person attends;
16	(5)	The person is physically present in the State; and
17	(6)	The person commits to employment with the State in the
18		amount of five years for an associate's degree or ten
19		years for a bachelor's, graduate, or professional
20		degree; provided that if the person does not obtain
21		the applicable degree, the person shall be obligated



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1		to refund the State for the pro-rata portion of the
2		grant for the number of credits remaining to obtain
3		the associate's, bachelor's, graduate, or professional
4		degree, as applicable; and provided further that if
5		the person does not fulfill the entire employment
6		commitment required by this paragraph in a state
7		position approved by the department of human resources
8		development, the person shall be obligated to refund
9		the State for the pro-rata portion of the grant for
10		the amount of employment commitment remaining.
11	(b)	The department of human resources development shall
12	develop a	list of approved state positions that fulfill the
13	employmen	t requirements established by this section.
14	(c)	As used in this section, an "eligible noncitizen"
15	means a person who is:	
16	(1)	A United States permanent resident who holds a
17		permanent resident card;
18	(2)	A conditional permanent resident of the United States;

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1 (3) The holder of an Arrival-Departure Record (I-94) from 2 the Department of Homeland Security showing any one of the following designations: 3 4 (A) Refugee; 5 (B) Asylum granted; 6 (C) Parolee; or 7 (D) Cuban-Haitian entrant. 8 (d) The department of human resources development shall 9 adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 that establish eligibility 10 for a tuition grant pursuant to this section." 11 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to pay for 14 tuition grants for qualifying students; provided that any 15 portion of the sum appropriated that has not been expended by 16 June 30, 2019, shall not lapse; provided further that any 17 remaining unencumbered balance on June 30, 2020, shall lapse to 18 the credit of the general fund. 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 20 human resources development for the purposes of this Act. 21 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.



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1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
