# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MARINE EVENTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that marine events
- 2 often require more than one year of advance planning in light of
- 3 the many responsibilities involved. For example, if ocean
- 4 access during an event will be from private property, the permit
- 5 applicant must provide proof of permission from the landowner
- 6 before a permit may be issued. Event organizers experience
- 7 hardships when the department of land and natural resources is
- 8 unable to approve or deny permit applications well in advance of
- 9 proposed events. The legislature finds that many individuals
- 10 have expressed interest in applying to the department of land
- 11 and natural resources for marine event permits up to one year in
- 12 advance of an event.
- The legislature is also aware of the immense popularity of
- 14 regattas, marine parades, surfing contests, and other marine
- 15 events in the State. During these events, ocean conditions can
- 16 be extremely hazardous to both participants and spectators.
- 17 Furthermore, spectators may use vessels, thrill craft, drones,

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1	and other	means to observe and capture photos and videos of
2	these ever	nts, which may interfere with the event, infringe upon
3	an event	organizer's exclusive use of areas designated for use
4	during the	e event, and put event participants at risk of serious
5	injury or	death. These issues arose during recent surf
6	contests,	such as the Peahi Challenge and the Quiksilver in
7	Memory of	Eddie Aikau.
8	Acco:	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
9	(1)	Prohibit the holding of a marine event without a
10		permit from the department of land and natural
11		resources or prior authorization from the United
12		States Coast Guard;
13	(2)	Allow individuals to apply for marine event permits up
14		to one year in advance of the date of a proposed
15		marine event; and
16	(3)	Authorize the department of land and natural resources
17		to adopt rules to mitigate the hazards posed by
18		vessels, thrill craft, drones, and other means used by
19		spectators to observe or record regattas, marine
20		parades, surfing contests, and other marine events in
21		the waters of the State.

1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding two new sections to part II to be
3	appropria	tely designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 20	0- Marine events; permits; exclusive use;
5	cancellat	ion fee. (a) No person shall hold a marine event,
6	including	but not limited to a regatta, marine parade, or
7	surfing c	ontest, without written authorization from the
8	departmen	t; provided that the department's written authorization
9	is not re	quired if prior authorization has been secured from the
10	Coast Gua	rd.
11	<u>(b)</u>	Authorization shall be in the form of a permit. All
12	permits a	nd permit applications shall be subject to the
13	following	<u>:</u>
14	(1)	Permit applications shall be on a form prescribed by
15		the department;
16	(2)	Permit applications may be submitted to the department
17		up to one year in advance of the date of a proposed
18		<pre>event;</pre>
19	(3)	The applicant shall submit the completed application,
20		proof of valid insurance, and proof of approval from
21		the land owner;

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1	(4)	The department shall use its best efforts to grant or
2		deny a permit within thirty days of receiving a permit
3		application;
4	<u>(5)</u>	The department shall charge a fee for issuance of
5		marine use permits under this section and collect an
6		additional \$250 nonrefundable deposit, which shall be
7		retained by the department if the permit is canceled
8		within sixty days of the scheduled date of the marine
9		event;
10	(6)	The department may issue an exclusive marine use
11		permit to an applicant to confer upon the applicant
12		the use of state waters and other areas under the
13		jurisdiction of the State that have been specifically
14		designated for use during the marine event, to the
15		exclusion of all others who are not the applicant or
16		event participants; provided that the department shall
17		charge an exclusive marine use permit fee for the
18		permit, which shall be higher than the permit fee
19		charged pursuant to paragraph (5); and
20	<u>(7)</u>	Any applicant who has been granted a permit under this
21		section and wants to cancel the permit shall request a

1	cancellation from the department in writing. If an
2	applicant who has been granted a permit under this
. 3	section submits a cancellation request to the
4	department less than ninety calendar days before the
5	scheduled date of the marine event, the department may
6	assess a cancellation fee.
7	The marine use permit fee, exclusive marine use permit fee,
8	and cancellation fee amounts to be charged by the department
9	pursuant to this subsection shall be determined by the
10	department.
11	(c) The department may adopt rules, pursuant to chapter
12	91, necessary to effectuate this section.
13	(d) As used in this section, "marine event" means an
14	organized water event of limited duration that is conducted
15	according to a prearranged schedule, and by its nature,
16	circumstances, or location, will introduce extra or unusual
17	hazards to the safety of persons or property in the waters of
18	the State.
19	§200- Event spectators; hazards; mitigation. The
20	department may adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 91, to mitigate
21	the hazards posed by vessels, thrill craft, drones, and other

- 1 means used by spectators to observe or record regattas, marine
- 2 parades, surfing contests, and other marine events held in the
- 3 waters of the State."
- 4 SECTION 3. The department of land and natural resources
- 5 shall submit a report of its progress in implementing the
- 6 permitting process and adopting rules pursuant to section 2 of
- 7 this Act, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature
- 8 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- 9 session of 2019.
- 10 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.

#### Report Title:

DLNR; Ocean Safety; Marine Events; Permits; Event Spectators; Rules

### Description:

Requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources to allow applications for marine event permits up to 1 year in advance and authorizes the Department to adopt rules to mitigate hazards posed by vessels, thrill craft, drones, and other means used by spectators to observe or record marine events. Requires a report to the 2019 Legislature. (SD2)

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
