A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD WELFARE SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the east Hawaii
- 2 child welfare services section on Hawaii island faces unique
- 3 challenges as the office responsible for the safety and well-
- 4 being of vulnerable children who have been abused or neglected
- 5 or who are at high risk for abuse and neglect.
- 6 The east Hawaii child welfare services section is
- 7 responsible for the safety of endangered children in a vast
- 8 geographic area that extends from Honokaa to Ocean View,
- 9 including the districts of north Hilo, south Hilo, Puna, and
- 10 much of Hamakua and Kau. This is an area approximately the size
- 11 of all of the other Hawaiian islands combined.
- 12 In 2015, the rate of confirmed cases for abuse or neglect
- 13 in the area serviced by the east Hawaii child welfare services
- 14 section was two hundred thirteen children per one hundred
- 15 thousand residents, which is nearly triple the rate of confirmed
- 16 cases per one hundred thousand residents on the island of Oahu.

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1	The legislature further finds that the great recession
2	triggered deep cuts in Hawaii's already overburdened child
3	welfare system and caused a long-term impact on the safety and
4	well-being of the most vulnerable children. Layoffs and hiring
5	restrictions caused the east Hawaii child welfare services
6	section to lose nineteen of the fifty-six positions it had in
7	2009. That reduction in staffing has caused a dramatic increase
8	in average caseloads. The Child Welfare League of America
9	recommends caseloads for social workers of no more than fifteen
10	children. In the east Hawaii child welfare services section,
11	social workers regularly have caseloads of forty to fifty
12	children. These higher caseloads increase the potential for
13	harm to children who are already experiencing or are at risk for
14	neglect or abuse and contribute to a crisis situation in east
15	Hawaii.
16	The east Hawaii child welfare services section workloads
17	have become so unmanageable that the department of human
18	services, child welfare services branch, has been sanctioned by
19	the family court because of late filings of reports and failure
20	to meet court deadlines.

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1	Apart from the moral obligation to protect the most
2	vulnerable children, the legislature is frustrated with the very
3	large sums of money paid each year for legal claims and
4	settlements, including some caused by tragedies in the State's
5	child welfare system.
6	Child and family services reviews conducted by the United
7	States Department of Health and Human Services have found that
8	the more time a social worker spends with a child and a family,
9	the better the outcomes for those children and families.
10	The purpose of this Act is to establish a five-year pilot
11	project within the department of human services to ensure the
12	safety and well-being of at-risk children and families in east
13	Hawaii on Hawaii island by:
14	(1) Appropriating funds for case managers, support staff,
15	and administrative costs for the east Hawaii child
16	welfare services section on Hawaii island and travel
17	costs for the child welfare services division to train
18	new hires; and
19	(2) Limiting the number of children supervised by each
20	east Hawaii child welfare services section social
21	worker to twenty or fewer.

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1	SECT	ION 2. (a) There is established within the department	
2	of human	services a five-year pilot project to be known as the	
3	east Hawa	ii child welfare services pilot project to assist	
4	children	and families in east Hawaii on Hawaii island. The	
5	department of human services shall provide oversight of the		
6	pilot project.		
7	(b)	The pilot project shall:	
8	(1)	Add eight full-time equivalent (8.0 FTE) case managers	
9		and fifteen full-time equivalent (15.0 FTE) support	
10		staff positions in the east Hawaii child welfare	
11		services section on Hawaii island; and	
12	(2)	Limit the number of children supervised by each east	
13		Hawaii child welfare services section social worker to	
14		twenty or fewer.	
15	(c)	The department of human services shall evaluate the	
16	effective	ness of the pilot project annually. The evaluation	
17	shall include:		
18	(1)	Findings as to whether the reduction in caseload	
19		helped social workers to engage families, deliver	
20		quality services, and achieve positive outcomes for	
21		children and families;	

1	(2)	Findings as to whether the reduction in caseload
2		affected employee performance, satisfaction, and
3		attrition at the east Hawaii child welfare services
4		section;
5	(3)	A comparison of the number and type of sanctions
6		imposed by the family court on the east Hawaii child
7		welfare services section on Hawaii island because of
8		late filings of reports and failure to meet court
9		deadlines during the five years preceding the pilot
10		project versus those that are imposed during the
11		pendency of the pilot project and twelve months after
12		it ends;
13	(4)	A comparison of the number of legal claims and
14		settlements relating to the child welfare system and
15		the east Hawaii child welfare services section on
16		Hawaii island brought and their disposition during the
17		five years preceding the pilot project versus those
18		that are imposed during the pendency of the pilot
19		project and twelve months after it ends; and
20	(5)	Any other data and analysis the department of human

services deems necessary.

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- 1 (d) Data on the conduct and efficacy of the pilot project
- 2 shall be collected by service providers that work directly with
- 3 children who are assigned to social workers in the east Hawaii
- 4 child welfare services section and shall be submitted to the
- 5 department of human services every six months for evaluation
- 6 purposes for the duration of the pilot project and twelve months
- 7 after it ends.
- 8 (e) The department of human services shall submit an
- 9 annual report of its findings and recommendations, including any
- 10 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
- 11 days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of 2019,
- 12 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023.
- 13 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$2,633,231 or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 16 east Hawaii child welfare services section pilot project,
- 17 including the hiring of eight full-time equivalent (8.0 FTE)
- 18 case managers and fifteen full-time equivalent (15.0 FTE)
- 19 support staff, administrative costs for the east Hawaii child
- 20 welfare services section on Hawaii island, and travel costs for
- 21 the child welfare services division to train new hires.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
