H.B. NO. 23

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature finds that the tuition schedule 1 SECTION 1. established by the board of regents of the University of Hawaii 2 has created an unreasonable increase in the cost of attendance. 3 For example, tuition fees for resident full-time undergraduate 4 students at the University of Hawaii at Manoa steadily increased 5 each academic year since 2011-2012, by approximately 3.1 per 6 cent in 2012-2013, 5.5 per cent in 2013-2014, 7.6 per cent in 7 2014-2015, 5.1 per cent in 2015-2016, and by another 5.1 per 8 cent in 2016-2017. 9

10 The legislature finds that the cost of tuition at the 11 University of Hawaii is a matter of statewide concern and that 12 it is in the best interests of the State to ensure that all 13 students have affordable access to higher education.

14 The purpose of this Act is to subject any tuition fee 15 increase at the University of Hawaii to legislative disapproval. 16 SECTION 2. Section 304A-401, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended to read as follows:



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"[+]§304A-401[+] Tuition fees; resident, nonresident;
other fees. (a) The board of regents may charge resident and
nonresident tuition fees for regular courses of instruction at
any University of Hawaii campus, including any community
college.

6 (b) The board may also charge other fees for special 7 programs of instruction, as well as laboratory fees, course 8 fees, fees for student activities, and an information technology 9 user fee. The board may charge other fees for summer session or 10 evening courses, including differential fees for nonresident 11 students.

(c) Prior to any regular credit or summer session tuition 12 fee increase taking effect, the proposed regular credit or 13 summer session tuition fee increase made pursuant to subsection 14 (a) or summer session tuition fee increase made pursuant to 15 subsection (b) shall be subject to disapproval by two-thirds 16 vote of either the senate or house of representatives or by 17 majority vote of both houses of the legislature in any regular 18 session following the date of the board of regents' approval of 19 the increase. The University of Hawaii shall submit for 20 introduction to the legislature a resolution for review of the 21



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1	regular credit or summer session tuition fee increase together
2	with a detailed justification for the increase."
3	SECTION 3. Section 304A-401, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as
4	amended by section 2 of this Act, shall apply to tuition fee
5	increases applicable to the 2018-2019 academic year and all
6	academic years thereafter, including summer sessions.
7	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
