A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

PART I

2 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many important 3 aspects of our State, including its economy and the way of life 4 of its communities, rely on the preservation of its beaches. However, beach loss has accelerated at an unprecedented rate in 5 6 recent decades, resulting in Hawaii losing more than seventeen 7 miles of beaches. Repeated king tides have deteriorated beaches 8 and sea walls and shoreline hardening has hastened the rate of beach loss. 9

10 As rising sea levels and intensifying erosion continue to 11 threaten beaches, Hawaii's economy faces tens of billions of 12 dollars in potential losses. The loss of Waikiki beach alone 13 would cause an estimated \$2,000,000,000 in annual losses to 14 Hawaii's economy. Losing similar beaches that are critical to 15 our communities would also be devastating, resulting in 16 significant decreases in property values, revenues to local 17 businesses, and the overall quality of life in the State.



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1	As bea	ches erode and retreat, the State may need to acquire
2	adjacent pr	ivate lands to ensure that space exists for beaches
3	and dune sys	stems to survive. The acquisition of adjacent land
4	will also e	nable continued public access to these priceless
5	community as	ssets. Additionally, acquiring adjacent property
6	will create	a buffer zone between the shoreline and developed
7	areas to pro	otect the State from potential natural disasters.
8	The put	rpose of this Act is to ensure the preservation of
9	Hawaii's bea	aches for future generations by:
10	(1) Es	stablishing a Hawaii beach preservation special fund
11	W	ithin the treasury of the State to be used to
12	pı	urchase lands threatened by sea level rise or beach

3	PART II
4	SECTION 2. Chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by adding a new section to part VIII to be appropriately
6	designated and to read as follows:
7	" <u>§171-</u> Hawaii beach preservation special fund. (a)
8	There is established a Hawaii beach preservation special fund
9	within the treasury of the State into which shall be deposited:
10	(1) All appropriations made by the legislature to the
11	fund; and
12	(2) Gifts, donations, and grants from public agencies and
13	private persons.
14	All interest earned or accrued on moneys deposited into the
15	fund shall become part of the fund.
16	(b) Subject to legislative appropriation, the department
17	of land and natural resources may expend moneys from the fund to
18	purchase from landowners any lands threatened by sea level rise
19	or beach erosion and to carry out other forms of managed retreat
20	for the protection of public beaches. Lands purchased pursuant
21	to this section shall be managed by the department.



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1	(c)	The department shall adopt rules in accordance with	
2	chapter 9	1 to effectuate the purposes of this section."	
3	SECTION 3. (a) There shall be established within the		
4	Hawaii climate change mitigation and adaptation commission a		
5	Hawaii beach preservation working group. The working group		
6	shall identify effective funding mechanisms for the Hawaii beach		
7	preservation special fund.		
8	(b)	The working group shall consider as possible funding	
9	mechanism	s for the Hawaii beach preservation special fund:	
10	(1)	Increases to the conveyance tax applicable to	
11		shoreline properties;	
12	(2)	Taxes or surcharges on real property; and	
13	(3)	Any other funding mechanism the working group deems	
14		appropriate.	
15	(C)	The commission shall determine the working group's	
16	membership from among its members.		
17	(d)	The working group shall submit a report with findings	
18	and recommendations, including proposed legislation, if any, to		
19	the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening		
20	of the regular session of 2019. Copies of the report shall be		
21	transmitted to the mayor of each county.		



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1	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general				
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so				
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to be				
4	deposited into the Hawaii beach preservation special fund.				
5	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii beach				
6	preservation special fund the sum of \$ or so much				
7	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the				
8	purpose of purchasing property from landowners threatened by sea				
9	level rise or beach erosion and carrying out other forms of				
10	managed retreat.				
11	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of				
12	land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.				
13	PART III				
14	SECTION 6. (a) There is established the north shore Oahu				
15	pilot program, to be administered by the department of land and				
16	natural resources, to address sea level rise and beach erosion				
17	by exploring managed retreat options for beach preservation in				
18	the State.				
19	(b) The north shore Oahu pilot program shall investigate				
20	and make recommendations for managed retreat options, including				
21	buyouts or other methods of land acquisition, that address				



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1 current emergency conditions at legacy beaches on Oahu's north 2 shore and that may be replicated elsewhere the State to preserve beaches with economic and cultural value. The pilot program 3 4 shall make recommendations for strategies that may be funded 5 through the Hawaii beach preservation special fund established pursuant to section 171- , Hawaii Revised Statutes. 6 focus on the north shore of Oahu and other beaches in the State 7 of Hawaii that have economic and cultural value. 8

9 (c) The north shore Oahu pilot program shall submit a
10 report of its findings and recommendations, including any
11 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
12 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2019.

13 (d) The north shore Oahu pilot project shall be dissolved14 on July 1, 2019.

15 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the 18 north shore Oahu pilot program.

19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of20 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.

3 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.

Department of Land and Natural Resources; Climate Change; Special Fund; Working Group; Pilot Program; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes a Hawaii beach preservation special fund. Authorizes the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) to expend moneys from the Hawaii Beach Preservation Special Fund to purchase lands threatened by sea level rise or beach erosion. Requires DLNR to manage the purchased lands. Creates a working group within the Hawaii Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission to determine appropriate funding mechanisms for the Hawaii beach preservation special fund. Establishes a North Shore Oahu Pilot Program under DLNR to explore managed retreat options. Appropriates funds. (HB2468 HD1)
