## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTORCYCLES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§291C- Driving on designated shoulder; two-wheeled
5	<b>motorcycles.</b> (a) The department of transportation, in its sole
6	discretion, may designate one or more shoulders upon which the
7	department of transportation may authorize the driving of two-
8	wheeled motorcycles; provided that:
9	(1) Any shoulder so designated shall be the shoulder of a
10	roadway with at least two lanes for vehicular traffic
11	moving in the same direction;
12	(2) The department of transportation shall not authorize:
13	(A) Drivers of two-wheeled motorcycles to maneuver
14	their vehicles onto a shoulder unless vehicular
15	traffic on the roadway is stopped as a result of
16	a marked or unmarked intersection or congestion;

	(B) The driving of two-wheeled motorcycles upon a
	shoulder:
	(i) At any speed exceeding ten miles per hour;
	or
	(ii) In a direction other than the direction of

	(C) Drivers of two-wheeled motorcycles to make any
	turn from any shoulder;
(3)	The department of transportation may impose additional
	restrictions on the maneuvering and driving of two-
	wheeled motorcycles onto and upon designated
	shoulders, including restrictions that are more
	stringent than those described in paragraph (2); and
(4)	The department of transportation shall clearly mark
	any designated shoulder with appropriate official
	traffic-control devices, including traffic-control

	motorcycles may begin to enter the shoulder and

provided that this subsection shall not be construed to prohibit 1 2 the operator of a two-wheeled motorcycle from traversing lanes 3 for the purpose of maneuvering onto a designated shoulder 4 pursuant to section 291C- (b)(2)." 5 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 6 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 7 begun before its effective date. SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 8 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 10 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050; 11 provided that on June 30, 2022, this Act shall be repealed and 12 sections 291C-43, 291C-44, 291C-49, 291C-125, and 291C-153, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which 13 they read on the day before the effective date of this Act. 14
