A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Wasmannia
- 2 auropunctata, known as the little fire ant, threatens native
- 3 biodiversity, alters tropical ecosystems, impairs human health,
- 4 impedes tourism, diminishes agricultural productivity, mars
- 5 horticulture sales, and accordingly ranks among the world's
- 6 worst invasive species. Human behaviors and habitats allow the
- 7 little fire ant to move quickly, disperse widely, grow to high
- 8 densities, and inhabit locations not otherwise possible.
- 9 Hawaii's tropical climate is ideally suited for little fire
- 10 ant establishment and growth. The little fire ant, by far one
- 11 of Hawaii's worst invasive pests, is not only bothersome to
- 12 residents, visitors, and farmers because of its nasty sting, it
- 13 also harms agriculture and natural areas by nurturing other
- 14 invasive pests such as aphids, mealybugs, soft scale insects,
- 15 and whiteflies.
- 16 The legislature further finds that when compared to the
- 17 other counties, the county of Hawaii has been affected the most

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- 1 by the little fire ant. The University of Hawaii, the county of
- 2 Hawaii, and the department of agriculture must collaborate to
- 3 develop and implement effective measures to address the impacts
- 4 of the little fire ant in the county of Hawaii.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to establish a pilot pesticide
- 6 treatment coupon project within the department of agriculture
- 7 and appropriate funds for this purpose.
- 8 SECTION 2. The department of agriculture shall establish
- 9 and implement a pilot pesticide treatment coupon project. The
- 10 pilot project shall distribute coupons redeemable for
- 11 appropriate pesticides at suppliers or vendors within the county
- 12 of Hawaii at no cost to individuals who have reported and
- 13 verified to the department the presence of little fire ants on
- 14 their property within the county of Hawaii. Each coupon shall
- 15 be valid for a one-year supply of the department's recommended
- 16 treatment plan, including supplies and equipment purchased from
- 17 private companies; provided that the value of the coupon shall
- 18 not exceed the cost of a one-year supply of the department's
- 19 recommended treatment plan. The department shall provide each
- 20 individual with information on the proper usage and health and

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- 1 safety precautions regarding the department's recommended
- 2 treatment plan.
- 3 SECTION 3. The department of agriculture shall submit a
- 4 report on its progress in implementing the mandates of this Act,
- 5 its findings and recommendations on whether the pilot project
- 6 should be continued, terminated, or modified, and any proposed
- 7 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 8 to the convening of the regular session of 2018.
- 9 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
- 12 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 13 year 2018-2019 for the little fire ant pilot pesticide treatment
- 14 coupon project established pursuant to section 2 of this Act.
- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 16 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 28, 2081.
