A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The department of health developmental
 disabilities division is the operating agency for the Hawaii

3 medicaid section 1915(c) Home and Community-Based Services for

4 People with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities waiver.

5 The department of health operates the waiver pursuant to a

 $\mathbf{6}$ memorandum of agreement with the department of human services,

7 which is the state medicaid agency supervising the

 $oldsymbol{8}$ administration of the waiver. Therefore, the department of

 $oldsymbol{9}$ health can claim allowable medicaid federal financial

10 participation for the proper and necessary costs incurred by the

11 department in administering the waiver. Administrative claiming

12 has become increasingly important to defray the rising costs to

13 states for administration of medicaid programs. To date, the

14 department of health has conducted minimal administrative

15 claiming, and without a special fund to deposit and use



1 administrative federal financial participation for operating the 2 medicaid section 1915(c) Home and Community-Based Services for 3 People with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities waiver, 4 the department will lack a fund to ensure the proper and 5 efficient administration of the waiver, and the growing federal 6 requirements for community integration, quality and 7 accountability. 8 The requirements of operating the waiver are specified in 9 the State's waiver application approved by the federal Centers 10 for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Through the delegated 11 functions, the department must assure the health and welfare of 12 waiver participants, coordinate services, and ensure the service 13 quality. Specific requirements for the operating authority 14 include completing initial intake for new waiver applicants, 15 completing annual re-determinations of level of care for 16 continued eligibility, performing fiscal oversight to ensure 17 that waiver enrollment and expenditures are managed against 18 federally approved limits, implementing person-centered planning 19 processes, developing and monitoring participant individualized

service plans, pre-authorizing waiver services, managing

- 1 utilization, enrolling qualified providers and provider
- 2 monitoring, establishing a statewide rate methodology,
- 3 developing policies and procedures for operating the waiver
- 4 subject to department of human services approval, and
- 5 implementing quality assurance and improvement activities for
- 6 required performance measures. The department is contracting to
- 7 develop a new information technology system to assist case
- 8 managers manage information and provide analytics. Many of the
- 9 activities performed by department staff or contracted entities
- 10 can be claimed as administrative costs.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 333F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 13 and to read as follows:

There is appropriated out of the intellectual 7 and developmental disabilities medicaid waiver administrative claiming special fund the sum of \$_____ or so much thereof 8 9 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to be used in 10 support of individuals with intellectual and developmental 11 disabilities. 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 13 health for the purposes of this Act. 14 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 16 SECTION 8. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect 17 on July 1, 2018. 18
