A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that on November 1, 1972,
- 2 business leaders of Hawaii and Japan met in Honolulu to
- 3 establish the Japan-Hawaii economic council. Their primary
- 4 motivations were to further economic relations between Japan and
- 5 the United States and to recognize Hawaii's important role in
- 6 that regard. For nearly thirty years, hundreds of business and
- 7 government leaders from Japan and Hawaii met at annual meetings,
- 8 alternating between Hawaii and Japan, to discuss and improve
- 9 business, tourism, investment, education, and other mutually
- 10 beneficial interests. These meetings improved relations,
- 11 increased cultural understandings, reduced trade restrictions.
- 12 and improved the economies of Japan, Hawaii, and the United
- 13 States.
- 14 The legislature finds that relations between China and
- 15 Hawaii today are similar to those that began to develop between
- 16 Japan and Hawaii in the 1960s and 1970s. The legislature
- 17 further finds that establishment of a similar China-Hawaii



- 1 economic council will provide an invaluable opportunity to
- 2 further economic relations between Hawaii and China, including
- 3 providing a better understanding of cultural differences,
- 4 facilitating investment, increasing tourism, and promoting
- 5 trade.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to establish the China-Hawaii
- 7 economic council to further economic relations between China and
- 8 Hawaii.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 11 and to read as follows:
- 12 "§201- China-Hawaii economic council. (a) There is
- 13 established within the department of business, economic
- 14 development, and tourism for administrative purposes the China-
- 15 Hawaii economic council to further economic relations between
- 16 China and Hawaii.
- 17 (b) The China-Hawaii economic council shall be governed by
- 18 a policymaking and oversight commission to be known as the
- 19 China-Hawaii economic council commission. The China-Hawaii
- 20 economic council commission shall consist of seven members
- 21 appointed by the governor as provided in section 26-34. Members



1	shall not	receive compensation but shall be reimbursed for
2	reasonable	e expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.
3	(c)	The China-Hawaii economic council commission shall
4	appoint a	n executive director of the China-Hawaii economic
5	council,	who shall:
6	(1)	Serve as the China-Hawaii economic council chief
7		executive officer;
8	(2)	Be responsible for developing and administering the
9		China-Hawaii economic council programs;
10	(3)	Serve on a part-time or full-time basis;
11	(4)	Be a person who, by reason of education or extensive
12		experience, is generally recognized as being
13		professionally qualified in China-Hawaii relations;
14	<u>(5)</u>	Be familiar with the people and cultures of Hawaii and
15		China;
16	(6)	Be exempt from chapter 76; and
17	(7)	Select and employ necessary additional staff pursuant
18		to chapter 76, subject to available appropriations.
19	<u>(d)</u>	Not later than December 31, 2022, the China-Hawaii
20	economic	council shall conduct the inaugural China-Hawaii
21	ogonomia	goungil general meeting with buginess and government

1	leaders from China and Hawaii. Subsequent China-Hawaii economic		
2	council general meetings shall occur annually.		
3	(e) Subsequent annual China-Hawaii economic council		
4	general meetings may:		
5	(1) Alternate between Hawaii and China; and		
6	(2) Include discussions on trade, tourism, education,		
7	investment, finance, communication, and culture.		
8	(f) The China-Hawaii economic council shall submit a		
9	report on the proceedings of each China-Hawaii economic council		
10	general meeting to the legislature no later than one-hundred		
11	eighty days following the closing of each China-Hawaii economic		
12	council general meeting."		
13	SECTION 3. The China-Hawaii economic council shall provide		
14	to the 2020, 2021, and 2022 legislatures an annual report no		
15	later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular		
16	session, which at a minimum shall include a description of		
17	progress made toward conducting the inaugural China-Hawaii		
18	economic council general meeting.		
19	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general		
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much		
21	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the		

- 1 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 2 2018-2019 for the China-Hawaii economic council.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 4 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes
- 5 of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
