# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INSURANCE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Critically ill patients in Hawaii may require

2 treatment on the continental United States. The cost of

3 transportation by an air ambulance can be a significant

4 financial burden that may not be covered by insurance.

5 Commercial flights are not an option because the patient

6 requires life supporting equipment and a medical support team.

7 For patients requiring transportation to the continental

8 United States, their only options are to mortgage their homes,

9 drain retirement savings, borrow from family or friends, or

10 establish a Gofundme.com campaign to raise funds. During the

11 time that a family is fundraising for a sick loved one, the

12 patient's condition can deteriorate rapidly and reduce the

chance of recovery. In addition, if the delay is too great,

14 then the accepting facility may give the patient's bed to

15 another individual and the patient is forced to find another

16 accepting facility.

1 The legislature finds that Medicaid currently covers the 2 cost of transportation for Hawaii's most needy families, but 3 those who are middle-income earners and working full-time do not 4 receive coverage for the cost of transportation to the 5 continental United States. The legislature also finds that due 6 to Hawaii's unique position in the middle of the Pacific Ocean, 7 residents deserve to receive life-saving medical care that is 8 not available in the State. The purpose of this Act is to ensure the provision of 9 **10** quality health care by requiring insurance coverage for the 11 costs of transportation to the continental United States for 12 qualifying patients. 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended by adding a new section to article 10A to be 15 appropriately designated and to read as follows: 16 "§431:10A- Qualifying patients; transportation cost **17** coverage. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, each policy 18 of accident and health or sickness insurance issued or renewed 19 in this State after December 31, 2018, providing coverage for 20 health care, except for policies that only provide coverage for 21 specified diseases or other limited benefit coverage, shall

3	For	purposes of this section, "qualifying patient" means a
4	patient t	hat meets all of the following criteria:
5	(1)	The patient displays a high risk of imminent death
6		with optimal available treatment in the State;
7	(2)	The patient has a diagnosis of a potentially
8		reversible disease or is a potential candidate for a
9		heart or lung, or both, transplant, destination
10		ventricular assist device, or total artificial heart;
11	(3)	The necessary treatment for the patient is not
12		available in the State;
13	(4)	The patient shall not have any known absolute
14		contraindications to the out-of-state treatment being
15		sought;
16	<u>(5)</u>	The patient is not being transported for the sole
17		purpose of cancer treatment or bone marrow transplant;
18		and
19	(6)	There is a receiving medical facility that has an
20		accepting medical team and support capability to
21		mitigate the immediate risk of death."

1	SECTION 3. Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statues, is amended		
2	by adding a new section to article I to be appropriately		
3	designated and to read as follows:		
4	"§432:1- Qualifying patients; transportation cost		
5	coverage. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, each		
6	hospital and medical service plan contract issued or renewed in		
7	this State after December 31, 2018, shall provide coverage for		
8	the costs of transportation to the continental United States for		
9	qualifying patients.		
10	For purposes of this section, "qualifying patient" means a		
11	patient that meets all of the following criteria:		
12	(1) The patient displays a high risk of imminent death		
13	with optimal available treatment in the State;		
14	(2) The patient has a diagnosis of a potentially		
15	reversible disease or is a potential candidate for a		
16	heart or lung, or both, transplant, destination		
17	ventricular assist device, or total artificial heart;		
18	(3) The necessary treatment for the patient is not		
19	available in the State;		

1	(4)	The patient shall not have any known absolute	
2		contraindications to the out-of-state treatment being	
3		sought;	
4	(5)	The patient is not being transported for the sole	
5		purpose of cancer treatment or bone marrow transplant;	
6		<u>and</u>	
7	(6)	There is a receiving medical facility that has an	
8		accepting medical team and support capability to	
9		mitigate the immediate risk of death."	
10	SECTION 4. Section 432D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
11	amended to read as follows:		
12	"§43	2D-23 Required provisions and benefits.	
13	Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, each		
14	policy, contract, plan, or agreement issued in the State after		
15	January 1, 1995, by health maintenance organizations pursuant to		
16	this chapter, shall include benefits provided in sections		
17	431:10-212, 431:10A-115, 431:10A-115.5, 431:10A-116, 431:10A-		
18	116.2, 431:10A-116.5, 431:10A-116.6, 431:10A-119, 431:10A-120,		
19	431:10A-121, 431:10A-122, 431:10A-125, 431:10A-126, 431:10A-132,		
20	431:10A-133, 431:10A-140, [and] 431:10A-134, and 431:10A-		
21	and chanter 431M "		

- 1 SECTION 5. Notwithstanding section 432D-23, Hawaii Revised
- 2 Statutes, the coverage and benefits for the transportation costs
- 3 for qualifying patients provided by health maintenance
- 4 organizations under section 4 of this Act shall apply to all
- 5 policies, contracts, plans, or agreements issued or renewed in
- 6 this State by a health maintenance organization after December
- **7** 31, 2018.
- 8 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
