### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 291E-62, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

11	(A) A term of imprisonment of not less than three
12	consecutive days but not more than thirty days;
13	(B) A fine of not less than $[\$250]$ $\$750$ but not more
14	than [ <del>\$1,000;</del> ] <u>\$3,000;</u>
15	(C) Revocation of license and privilege to operate a
16	vehicle for an additional year: and

1		(D) Loss of the privilege to operate a vehicle
2		equipped with an ignition interlock device, if
3		applicable;
4	(2)	For an offense that occurs within five years of a
5		prior conviction for an offense under this section,
6		section 291E-66, or section 291-4.5 as that section
7		was in effect on December 31, 2001:
8		(A) Thirty days imprisonment;
9		(B) A [ <del>\$1,000</del> ] <u>\$3,000</u> fine;
10		(C) Revocation of license and privilege to operate a
11		vehicle for an additional two years; and
12		(D) Loss of the privilege to operate a vehicle
13		equipped with an ignition interlock device, if
14		applicable; and
15	(3)	For an offense that occurs within five years of two or
16		more prior convictions for offenses under this
17		section, section 291E-66, or section 291-4.5 as that
18		section was in effect on December 31, 2001, or any
19		combination thereof:
20		(A) One year imprisonment;
21		(B) A [ <del>\$2,000</del> ] <u>\$6,000</u> fine;

1	(C)	Permanent revocation of the person's license and
2		privilege to operate a vehicle; and
3	(D)	Loss of the privilege to operate a vehicle
4		equipped with an ignition interlock device, if
5		applicable."
6	SECTION 2	. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
7	matured, penal	ties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
8	begun before i	ts effective date.
9	SECTION 3	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
10	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 4	. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
