## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

---

URGING THE INTERNATIONAL OLYMPIC COMMITTEE, INTERNATIONAL  
PARALYMPIC COMMITTEE, UNITED STATES OLYMPIC COMMITTEE, AND  
THE TOKYO ORGANISING COMMITTEE OF THE OLYMPIC AND  
PARALYMPIC GAMES TO ENCOURAGE OLYMPIC AND PARALYMPIC  
ATHLETES TO TRAIN IN HAWAII FOR THE 2020 SUMMER OLYMPICS  
AND THE 2020 SUMMER PARALYMPICS.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii has a rich cultural, historical, and  
2 spiritual heritage in sports and athletics; and  
3

4 WHEREAS, sports were a significant part of Native Hawaiian  
5 culture and life, with athletics being an important way of  
6 showcasing the physical abilities of Hawaiian warriors; and  
7

8 WHEREAS, competitive sports were an important element in  
9 the ceremonies associated with the Makahiki season, with ali'i  
10 and commoners alike training to compete; and  
11

12 WHEREAS, athletics remains an important part of Hawaii's  
13 culture, with the State holding a large number of major  
14 international and national sports events each year, including  
15 the Honolulu Marathon; Moloka'i Hoe Canoe Race; IRONMAN World  
16 Championship; XTERRA World Championship; Maui Jim Maui  
17 Invitational; major golf tournaments including the Sony Open and  
18 Mitsubishi Electric Championship; and numerous surfing events  
19 including The Quicksilver in memory of Eddie Aikau Big Wave  
20 Invitational and the Vans Triple Crown of Surfing; and

22 WHEREAS, sports tourism has also been a major driver of  
23 Hawaii's economy, producing \$144,000,000 in economic impacts in  
24 2016; and  
25

26 WHEREAS, the International Olympic Committee approved the  
27 addition of baseball, softball, karate, sport climbing, surfing,



1 and skateboarding to the 2020 Summer Olympics, and the  
2 International Paralympic Committee approved the addition of  
3 badminton and taekwondo to the 2020 Summer Paralympics; and  
4

5 WHEREAS, many of these new sport additions have long, rich  
6 traditions in the State, most notably the sport of surfing, the  
7 heritage of which can be directly traced to the Native  
8 Hawaiians; and  
9

10 WHEREAS, in addition to the State's rich sports legacy,  
11 Hawaii is blessed with the spirit of aloha and is welcoming to  
12 all visiting athletes, including all potential Olympic or  
13 Paralympic athletes; and  
14

15 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii is eager and prepared to work  
16 together with the International Olympic Committee, International  
17 Paralympic Committee, United States Olympic Committee, and the  
18 Tokyo Organising Committee of the Olympic and Paralympic Games  
19 to welcome all athletes who wish to train for the 2020 Summer  
20 Olympics and 2020 Summer Paralympics in Hawaii; now, therefore,  
21

22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
23 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
24 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that the International Olympic  
25 Committee, International Paralympic Committee, United States  
26 Olympic Committee, and the Tokyo Organising Committee of the  
27 Olympic and Paralympic Games are urged to encourage Olympic and  
28 Paralympic Athletes training to compete in the 2020 Summer  
29 Olympics and 2020 Summer Paralympics to conduct their athletic  
30 training in Hawaii; and

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the United States  
34 Secretary of State, members of Hawaii's Congressional  
35 Delegation, Governor, Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii  
36 Tourism Authority, Chairperson of the Stadium Authority,  
37 Director of Athletics of the University of Hawaii at Manoa,  
38 Chairperson of the Disability and Communication Access Board,  
39 Mayor of each county, President of the International Olympic  
40 Committee, President of the International Paralympic Committee,  
41 Chief Executive Officer of the United States Olympic Committee,  
42 Director General of the Tokyo Organising Committee of the

1 Olympic and Paralympic Games, Dean of the Consular Corps of  
2 Hawaii, and President of the Hawaii Lodging and Tourism
