

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE OF HAWAII DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO CONVENE AND PARTICIPATE IN THE HAWAII LEGAL AID INTERAGENCY ROUNDTABLE TO BETTER SERVE LOW-INCOME, VULNERABLE, AND AT-RISK POPULATIONS AND INCREASE THE AVAILABILITY OF MEANINGFUL ACCESS TO JUSTICE FOR FAMILIES AND INDIVIDUALS IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the Department of Human Services is responsible 1 for providing essential human services and protecting the health 2 3 and well-being of all of Hawaii's residents, especially those who are least able to help themselves; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Department of the Attorney General is 6 responsible for providing public services and legal support to 7 the State, its departments, and agencies; and 8 9 WHEREAS, many Hawaii residents face gaps in the 10 availability of legal aid - including legal representation, 11 advice, community education, and self-help and technology tools 12 - especially those who are most vulnerable and underserved; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the 2007 Assessment of Civil Legal Needs and 15 Barriers of Low- and Moderate-Income People in Hawaii found that 16 only one in five people have their civil legal needs addressed 17 and that only one in three people who contacted a civil legal 18 service provider were able to get assistance; and 19 20 WHEREAS, there is only one legal services attorney for 21 every 2,291 persons living below 125 percent of the federal 22 poverty level and only one attorney for every 4,402 persons 23 living below 200 percent of the poverty level; and 24



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WHEREAS, significant barriers to obtaining legal assistance 1 exist in Hawaii including, in addition to the inability to 2 afford an attorney, language and cultural barriers, lack of 3 knowledge of one's rights or the availability of services, and 4 difficulty in accessing legal services programs; and 5 6 WHEREAS, equal access to justice helps individuals and 7 families receive health services, housing, education, and 8 employment; enhances family stability and public safety; and 9 secures the public's faith in the justice system; and 10 11 WHEREAS, guaranteeing access to legal solutions improves 12 outcomes for those seeking assistance and results in cost 13 savings to the State in the long term by preventing or reducing 14 problems like homelessness, poverty, and health issues that can 15 be costly and harmful to individuals and the public; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the Fourteenth Amendment of the United States 18 Constitution ensures equal justice under the law and no state 19 shall "deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal 20 protection of the laws"; and 21 22 WHEREAS, goal sixteen of the United Nations' 2030 Agenda 23 for Sustainable Development is to promote just, peaceful, and 24 inclusive societies that provide access to justice for all and 25 build effective and accountable institutions at all levels; and 26 27 WHEREAS, a roundtable allows different stakeholders to come 28 to the table to exchange ideas and information, plan, and 29 coordinate, which allows programs to be more efficient and 30 produce better outcomes; now, therefore, 31 32 33 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 34 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that the State of Hawaii 35 Department of Human Services and the Department of the Attorney 36 General are urged to convene the Hawaii Legal Aid Interagency 37 Roundtable (Roundtable); and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human 40 Services and the Department of the Attorney General are urged to 41 participate, and the Attorney General and the Director of Human 42



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Services, or their designees, are urged to serve as co-chairs of 1 2 the Roundtable; and 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Roundtable is requested to 4 submit an annual report to the Governor and the Legislature on 5 its success in achieving its mission no later than 20 days prior 6 to the convening of each regular session; and 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Roundtable is requested to 9 submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature on the 10 economic impact of funding access to civil legal services no 11 later than January 1, 2020; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that representatives from the 14 following government agencies are urged to participate in the 15 Roundtable: 16 17 The Department of Health; (1)18 19 The Executive Office on Aging; (2) 20 21 The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs; (3) 22 23 The Department of Labor and Industrial Relations; 24 (4) 25 (5) The Office of Community Services; 26 27 (6) The Hawaii Public Housing Authority; 28 29 (7) The Hawaii Civil Rights Commission; 30 31 The Office of Hawaiian Affairs; 32 (8) 33 The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands; (9) 34 35 The Department of Public Safety; and (10)36 37 Any other government agency the co-chairs may, from 38 (11)time to time, designate; and 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the co-chairs may invite the 41 participation of the Judiciary, Access to Justice Commission, 42



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and Hawaii Consortium of Legal Service Providers to the extent 1 consistent with law and legal obligations; and 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 4 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Attorney 5 General, Director of Human Services, Director of Health, 6 Director of the Executive Office on Aging, Director of Commerce 7 and Consumer Affairs, Director of Labor and Industrial 8 Relations, Executive Director of the Office of Community 9 Services, Executive Director of the Hawaii Public Housing 10 Authority, Executive Director of the Hawaii Civil Rights 11 Commission, Chief Executive Officer of the Office of Hawaiian 12 Affairs, Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission, and the 13 Director of Public Safety. 14 15 16
