

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT PARTICIPANTS IN PUBLIC DEMONSTRATIONS OTHER THAN RECOGNIZED EVENTS SUCH AS MARATHONS AND PARADES FOLLOW TRAFFIC LAWS WHEN CROSSING STREETS.

WHEREAS, the First Amendment to the Constitution of the 1 United States of America grants the right of free expression, 2 including the right to peaceably assemble; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, public demonstrations have a long history in the United States as a means by which the public may express support 6 for policies, voice outrage for injustices, and call for action 7 on the part of elected officials and other public figures; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, although the right to peaceably assemble is a valuable and vital component of public engagement in the United 11 States, it is not absolute; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the United States of America 14 has consistently held in numerous cases, including Ward v. Rock 15 Against Racism, 491 U.S. 781, 109 S.Ct. 2746 (1989), that the 16 government may impose restrictions on the time, place, and 17 manner of peaceable assembly, provided that constitutional 18 19 safeguards are met; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the right of demonstrators to assemble and express 22 their position must be fairly and justly balanced against the 23 government's interest in providing for the safety and security of the public; and 24 25 WHEREAS, many counties, municipalities, and other local 26 governments require the organizers of public demonstrations and 27 other public events to apply for and be granted a permit; and 28 29 WHEREAS, even if a public demonstration or other event does 30 31 not require a permit, local governments may still require 32 participants to follow traffic and public safety ordinances; and

1 WHEREAS, law enforcement, including sheriffs with the 2 Department of Public Safety, direct traffic during public 3 demonstrations, which sometimes impede traffic unnecessarily, 4 causing unsafe conditions for pedestrians and motorists; now, 5 therefore, 6 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 9 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, the Senate concurring, that organizers and participants 10 in marches, rallies, and public demonstrations are requested to 11 follow traffic laws and public safety ordinances when crossing 12 streets; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that law enforcement, including the sheriffs of the Department of Public Safety, are urged to 16 17 consider the safety and convenience not just of demonstrators but of motorists as well; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this request does not apply to 20 recognized and permitted events such as marathons and parades; 21 22 and 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 24 25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Public Safety, Office of the Mayor of each county, and Chief of Police 26 of each county. 27 28 29 30 OFFERED BY:
