HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING CONGRESS TO RECOGNIZE THE INCREASING STATE-LEVEL OPPOSITION TO THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION'S REPEAL OF NET NEUTRALITY AND TO IMMEDIATELY ACT TO RESTORE NET NEUTRALITY REGULATIONS.

1 WHEREAS, in 2015, the Federal Communications Commission 2 adopted net neutrality regulations to protect internet users and 3 ensure all content over the Internet was treated equally and 4 without preferential treatment; and 5

6 WHEREAS, however, in 2017, the Federal Communications 7 Commission voted to repeal net neutrality regulations despite 8 heavy opposition by net neutrality supporters who argued the 9 deregulation would allow internet service providers the 10 opportunity to limit or prioritize certain access to information 11 at their discretion; and

WHEREAS, in February 2018, Hawaii Governor David Ige signed
an executive order that required all state agencies to obtain
their internet-related services from internet service providers
who agree to abide by net neutrality principles; and

18 WHEREAS, Governor Ige has joined governors from Montana,
19 New York, New Jersey, and Vermont in signing executive orders on
20 protecting net neutrality principles; and

22 WHEREAS, in March 2018, Washington became the first state 23 to pass a law making it illegal for internet service providers 24 to manipulate their networks for money, while dozens of other 25 states are considering similar measures through legislation and 26 lawsuits; and

28 WHEREAS, in context of the repeal of net neutrality 29 regulations set to take effect on April 23, 2018, it is in the



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State's interest to explore the possibility of establishing a 1 state-owned public utility company to provide high-speed 2 broadband internet service, similar to municipalities such as 3 Chattanooga, Tennessee, and Sandy, Oregon, which have had 4 success with public companies providing internet service; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that it is essential to ensure that people can access websites and information freely 8 9 and fairly over the Internet; now, therefore, 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 11 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 12 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that Congress is urged to 13 recognize the increasing state-level opposition to the Federal 14 Communications Commission's repeal of net neutrality and to 15 immediately act to restore net neutrality regulations; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and 18 Consumer Affairs is requested to study the costs and benefits to 19 the State to supply high-speed broadband internet service 20 through a state-owned public utility company; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and 23 Consumer Affairs is requested to submit a report of findings and 24 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 25 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 26 the Regular Session of 2019; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President Pro 30 Tempore, Majority Leader, and Minority Leader of the United 31 States Senate, the Speaker, Majority Leader, and Minority Leader 32 of the United States House of Representatives, Hawaii's 33 Congressional Delegation, Chairperson of the Federal 34 Communications Commission, the respective Governors and 35 presiding officers of the legislative bodies of each of the 36 other forty-nine states, the Governor, and the Director of 37 Commerce and Consumer Affairs. 38 39 40 41



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
