HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE THIRTY-DAY PERIOD FROM THE LAST SATURDAY IN SEPTEMBER TO THE LAST SUNDAY IN OCTOBER AS MALAMA PU'ULOA MONTH.

WHEREAS, based on radiocarbon dating, also known as Carbon-1 14 dating, the oldest settlement on Oahu is in present-day West 2 Loch area; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Nanaulu family, one of the first settlers in 5 Hawaii from Tahiti, settled in an area originally known as 6 Keawalauopu'uloa, or "the many harbors of Pu'uloa," in 400 A.D.; 7 8 and 9 WHEREAS, many areas in Pu'uloa in the greater 'Ewa region 10 are important sites in Hawaiian history; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, Pu'uloa in 'Ewa was the only moku in which all rivers in the twelve ahupua'a flowed to one place; and 14 15 WHEREAS, 'Ewa was the center of government during ancient 16 times and was the location of ancient political capitals, 17 18 including Lihue, Waikele, Lepau, and Pu'uloa; and 19 WHEREAS, many important historical figures were from 'Ewa 20 and Pu'uloa, such as Kalaiopu'u, who was the grandfather of 21 Kamehemeha, and Kalaimanuia, who served as the second female moi 22 chiefess of the island of Oahu; and 23 24 WHEREAS, current residents in 'Ewa are planning service 25 activities and community gatherings, including events in 26 Kapapapuhi Point Park, with the purpose of restoring Pu'uloa back 27 to its original state; now, therefore, 28
