## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENDORSING TAIWAN'S PARTICIPATION AS AN OBSERVER IN THE UNITED NATIONS FRAMEWORK CONVENTION ON CLIMATE CHANGE, INTERNATIONAL CIVIL AVIATION ORGANIZATION, WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION, AND INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL POLICE ORGANIZATION; ENCOURAGING A U.S.-TAIWAN BILATERAL TRADE AGREEMENT; AND CELEBRATING THE STATE OF HAWAII'S TWENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF SISTER-STATE RELATIONS WITH TAIWAN.

1	WHEREAS, as a global citizen, Taiwan upholds the universal
2 3	values of peace, freedom, democracy, and human rights; and
3 4	WHEREAS, Taiwan is a committed provider of humanitarian
5	aid; from malaria prevention programs in Africa, to agricultural
6	projects in Latin America and the Caribbean; from medical
7	missions in the South Pacific, to disaster relief in Asia; these
8	are a few examples of how Taiwan has consistently strived to
9	make a real difference throughout the world; and
10 11	WHEREAS, for years, Taiwan has actively engaged in climate
12	change research, supported anti-terrorism cooperation, and
13	worked with its partners to tackle transnational crime; and
14	-
15	WHEREAS, through its participation in its annual World
16	Health Assembly since April of 2009, Taiwan has shared its
17 18	renowned expertise in disease control and prevention; and
18 19	WHEREAS, Taiwan's meaningful participation in international
20	bodies such as the World Health Organization, International
21	Criminal Police Organization, United Nations Framework
22	Convention on Climate Change, and International Civil Aviation
23	Organization would make international mechanisms truly global;
24	and
25 26	WHEREAS, Hawaii has a strong cultural, historical, and
27	economic relationship with Taiwan since sister-state relations
28	were established on December 19, 1993, and the bonds of true

friendship and a steadfast trade partnership have strengthened 1 over the past twenty-five years; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, Taiwan is the tenth largest trading partner of the 5 United States with more than \$65,000,000,000 in goods traded between the United States and Taiwan in 2016, and the United 6 7 States is the leading country for foreign direct investment in Taiwan; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the deep economic relationship between the United 10 States and Taiwan has created hundreds of thousands of jobs in 11 12 the United States that rely on exports to Taiwan; now, therefore, 13 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 16 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that this body joins the United 17 States in endorsing the participation of Taiwan as an observer 18 in the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, 19 20 International Civil Aviation Organization, World Health Organization, and International Criminal Police Organization; 21 and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body also joins the United 24 25 States House of Representatives in encouraging the United States Trade Representative to commence negotiations to enter into a 26 bilateral trade agreement with Taiwan; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body supports the State of 29 Hawaii's twenty-fifth anniversary of sister-state relations with 30 31 Taiwan; and 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 34 United States; President Pro Tempore of the United States 35 Senate; Speaker of the United States House of Representatives; 36 37
