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HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO EVALUATE AND MAKE RECOMMENDATION ON FACILITATING THE RE-USE OF WATER IN HAWAII.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has been blessed with consistent rainfall, 1 advantageous geology, and high-quality drinking water stores for 2 3 centuries; and 4 WHEREAS, recent findings have raised concern about the 5 long-term fresh water security in the State, as the University 6 of Hawaii and other scientists have documented troubling trends 7 in recent decades, including reduced rainfall, higher 8 temperatures, higher evaporation rates, declining stream flows, 9 and increased incidents of drought; and 10 11 WHEREAS, if current trends hold, in the year 2030, Hawaii 12 will receive only three-quarters of the rain that fell in 1985; 13 and 14 15 WHEREAS, multiple prediction models tend to agree that 16 regardless of overall rainfall amounts, the dry and leeward side 17 of Hawaii, where the majority of the State's population lives, 18 will experience reduced rainfall and increased potential 19 evapotranspiration, which simultaneously creates less supply and 20 more demand for water; and 21 22 WHEREAS, increased water runoff and less aquifer recharge 23 continue to occur as the State converts open agricultural land 24 into land for development; and 25 26 WHEREAS, Hawaii's population has doubled since statehood 27 and is expected to double again in the next sixty years, not 28 including the more than two hundred thousand tourists the State 29 hosts each day; and 30 31



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WHEREAS, the projected population rise, coupled with trends 1 indicating the likelihood of a reduction in fresh water in 2 Hawaii, suggests that Hawaii is entering into an era of fresh 3 water uncertainty, which creates an urgent need to guard our 4 future water supply; and 5 6 WHEREAS, a drier, hotter future has serious consequences 7 for the long-term availability of fresh water in Hawaii, and 8 thereby threatens the economic security of the State; and 9 10 WHEREAS, increasing the amount of water re-use in the State 11 will alleviate pressure on fresh drinking water supplies; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Fresh Water Initiative, organized by 14 the Hawaii Community Foundation, was launched in 2013 to bring 15 multiple, diverse parties together to develop a forward-thinking 16 and consensus-based strategy to increase water security for the 17 State; and 18 19 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Fresh Water Initiative has relied on a 20 blue ribbon advisory panel of individuals, known as the Hawaii 21 Fresh Water Initiative Fresh Water Council, with deep knowledge 22 of water and a collaborative spirit to articulate a vision for a 23 more secure and sustainable water future based on shared values, 24 and shared sacrifice; and 25 26 WHEREAS, members of the Hawaii Fresh Water Initiative Fresh 27 Water Council have agreed to continue working together to help 28 implement the recommendations of the Hawaii Fresh Water 29 Initiative and are committed to seeing the recommendations 30 adopted and implemented; and 31 32 WHEREAS, both the Department of Health and the Hawaii 33 Community Foundation are dedicated to the goal of increasing 34 water re-use across the State by thirty million gallons per day 35 by 2030; now, therefore, 36 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 38 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 39 of 2018, that the Department of Health is requested to convene a 40

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Review findings of how water re-use and gray water 1 (2) regulations are administered in other states and 2 localities and in other countries, and assess the 3 feasibility of implementing similar regulations in 4 Hawaii; 5 6 Examine proposed language for future regulation or (3) 7 8 policy changes in Hawaii; and 9 Identify and rank potential demonstration projects for (4) 10 water re-use in Hawaii; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 13 report its findings and recommendations, including any proposed 14 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior 15 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2020; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 18 requested to provide administration and clerical support to the 19 task force; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 22 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Chair 23 of the House Committee on Water and Land, the Chair of the 24 Senate Committee on Water and Land, the Mayor of each county, 25 the Director of Health, the Director of the Legislative 26 Reference Bureau, and the Manager of the Honolulu Board of Water 27 Supply. 28 29 30 31 OFFERED BY:

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
