A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§353- Inmate release; important government documents.
- 5 (a) The department shall work with the federal Social Security
- 6 Administration to enter into an agreement to establish an
- 7 effective, secure, and efficient means for staff from both
- 8 agencies to process applications from inmates for replacement
- 9 social security cards.
- 10 (b) Upon entering into the agreement in subsection (a),
- 11 the department shall assist each inmate in applying for and
- 12 obtaining a social security card before the inmate's release
- 13 from custody if the inmate needs a social security card;
- 14 provided that for an inmate released to a work furlough,
- 15 extended furlough, or community placement programs, the
- 16 department shall initiate the process of obtaining a social

1	security	card at least ninety days prior to the inmate being	
2	released.		
3	<u>(c)</u>	Subsection (b) shall not apply to inmates who:	
4	(1)	Have a valid social security card, as determined by	
5		the department, unless the social security card has	
6		been lost, destroyed, or stolen;	
7	(2)	Have an active detainer, unless the department	
8		determines that cancellation of the detainer is likely	
9		or that the incarceration for which the detainer was	
10		issued will be less than twelve months in duration; or	
11	(3)	Are pretrial detainees or have been sentenced to less	
12		than one year of imprisonment.	
13	(d)	The department, in conjunction with the department of	
14	health, t	he department of transportation, and the examiner of	
15	drivers o	f each respective county, shall provide, free of charge	
16	by waivin	g all fees, for eligible inmates who are Hawaii-born, a	
17	certified	copy of the inmate's birth certificate and a civil	
18	identific	ation card before the inmate's release on parole or	
19	upon expiration of the inmate's sentence. A replacement		
20	driver's	license or replacement civil identification card shall	
21	be provid	ed in lieu of a civil identification card if an inmate	

1	has a val	id driver's license or civil identification card issued
2	in the St	ate that was lost, destroyed, or stolen. If the
3	replaceme	nt civil identification card or replacement driver's
4	<u>license i</u>	ssued is within six months of expiration, the examiner
,5	of driver	s of the respective county of issue may also issue a
6	temporary	permit, valid for at least six months after the
7	inmate's	release date, to assist the inmate in the inmate's
8	transitio	n. For an inmate released to work furlough, extended
9	furlough,	or community placement programs, the department shall
10	initiate	the process of obtaining a birth certificate, driver's
11	license,	or civil identification card as described in this
12	section a	t least ninety days prior to the inmate being released.
13	<u>(e)</u>	Subsection (d) shall not apply to inmates who:
14	(1)	Have an active detainer, unless the department
15		determines that cancellation of the detainer is likely
16		or that the incarceration for which the detainer was
17		issued will be less than twelve months in duration; or
18	(2)	Are pretrial detainees or have been sentenced to less
19		than one year of imprisonment.
20	<u>(f)</u>	The department, for purposes of assisting the inmate
21	in obtaining a birth certificate, shall submit to the departmen	

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- 1 of health the following information for all Hawaii-born inmates
- 2 in the custody of the department:
- 3 (1) Photo or digitized photo;
- 4 (2) Date of birth;
- 5 (3) Full name at birth and any subsequent legal name
- 6 changes;
- 7 (4) City and island of birth;
- 8 (5) Mother's full name, including maiden name; and
- 9 (6) Father's full name.
- 10 (g) For inmates born outside the State, the department
- 11 shall assist the inmate in completing the necessary forms or
- 12 applications to obtain a birth certificate and driver's license
- 13 or civil identification card. The department shall also provide
- 14 the inmate with the location and address of the appropriate
- 15 licensing authority from which the inmate may obtain a valid
- 16 identification card in proximity to the inmate's release
- 17 address.
- 18 (h) The department, as part of its annual report to the
- 19 legislature pursuant to section 353C-2, shall:

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1	(1)	Report on the number of inmates released with and	
2		without social security cards, identification cards or	
3		driver's licenses, and birth certificates;	
4	(2)	Identify any impediments in the implementation of this	
5		section; and	
6	(3)	Provide recommendations to improve the process of	
7		obtaining the documents identified in this section for	
8		all inmates."	
9	SECT	ION 2. There is appropriated out of the general	
10	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much	
11	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 for the		
12	purposes of this Act.		
13	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of	
14	public safety for the purposes of this Act.

16	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.
