## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to:
3	(1) Appropriate funds to the Hawaii health systems
4	corporation to improve the health care services
5	related to cardiac care at Hilo medical center; and
6	(2) Require the Auditor to audit contracts over \$1,000,000
7	that the Department of Health and the Department of
8	Human Services have entered into with domestic
9	violence nonprofit organizations.
10	SECTION 2. The legislature finds that a cardiac care unit
11	is needed in Hawaii county as the county's residents suffering
12	from heart problems or strokes are often airlifted to Oahu or
13	Maui to receive critical medical care. An individual suffering
14	from cardiac complications must receive interventional care
15	within two hours in order to recover completely. An evaluation
16	and airlift to Oahu or Maui, however, can take much more than

- 1 two hours, increasing the risk that the patient may not fully
- 2 recover.
- 3 The legislature further finds that while there are barriers
- 4 to offering interventional cardiology for heart attack treatment
- 5 to Hawaii county residents, Hilo medical center has reduced many
- 6 of these barriers. This has been done through the acquisition
- 7 and installation of cardiac imaging equipment and software, as
- 8 well as establishing cardiology clinic infrastructure designed
- 9 for up to three cardiologists and supporting providers. Because
- 10 cardiac interventions are complicated procedures, it is
- 11 important that Hilo medical center receives support in order to
- 12 expand its offering of interventional cardiology for heart
- 13 attack treatment, and thereby continue to save lives and improve
- 14 the quality of life for cardiac patients.
- 15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to the
- 18 Hawaii health systems corporation to improve the health care
- 19 services at Hilo medical center; provided that the funds shall
- 20 be used for the following:

1	(1)	Costs associated with recruiting and employing two
. 2		additional cardiologists while they establish their
3		invasive cardiology practice;
4	(2)	Costs of support staff required to support the
5		cardiology practice;
6	(3)	Initial training of catheterization lab, intensive
7		care unit, and radiology staff;
8	(4)	Purchasing of inventory of medical devices and
9		medications used for interventional cardiology
10		procedures;
11	(5)	Purchasing of medical equipment for the cardiac
12		catheterization lab and intensive care unit;
13	(6)	Purchasing of diagnostic laboratory equipment; and
14	(7)	Initial costs of a certified lab technician.
15	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the Hawaii health
<b>16</b> .	systems c	orporation for the purposes of this Act.
17		PART II
18	SECT	ION 4. (a) The auditor shall conduct an audit of each
19	contract	that the department of health or the department of
20	human ser	vices has entered into with domestic violence nonprofit
21	organizat	ions in the past years. The audits shall focus

1	on accour	tability and oversight of the state funding expended
2	pursuant	to each contract including:
3	(1)	The percentage of total expenditures under each
4		contract allocated for staff and administrative costs
5		compared to the costs of providing services directly
6		for domestic violence victims;
7	(2)	Recommendations on department contracting practices to
8		improve comprehensive care for domestic violence
9		victims; and
10	(3)	Recommendations on best contracting practices to
11		increase efficiency by reducing staff and
12		administrative expenditures so that more funds may be
13		expended for the direct benefit of domestic violence
14		victims.
15	(b)	The office of the auditor shall submit a report of its
16	findings	and recommendations, including any proposed
17	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
18	to the co	onvening of the regular session of 2019.

PART III

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

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## Report Title:

Hilo Medical Center; Cardiac Care; Department of Human Services; Department of Health; Auditor; Domestic Violence Nonprofit Organizations; Appropriation

## Description:

Appropriates funds to improve the health care services related to cardiac care at Hilo Medical Center. Requires the Auditor to audit contracts over \$1,000,000 that the Department of Health or the Department of Human Services entered into with domestic violence nonprofit organizations. (SB1235 HD1)

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
