A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that agricultural theft
- 2 and vandalism are a constant worry for farmers and ranchers.
- 3 Given the broad acreage that many farming and ranching
- 4 operations encompass, it is often difficult for farmers and
- 5 ranchers to police their entire operations at all times.
- 6 Furthermore, vigilance at night after work hours may be
- 7 challenging because not all farmers and ranchers are able to
- 8 live on or near the fields where they work. All of these
- 9 factors make agricultural operations easy prey for theft or
- 10 vandalism.
- 11 The legislature also finds that the county of Hawaii is
- 12 known as the breadbasket of the State. However, agricultural
- 13 theft and vandalism have been a constant threat for farmers and
- 14 ranchers on the island, increasing the cost of production and
- 15 making it more difficult for farming and ranching operations to
- 16 be successful.



1	The legislature also finds that individuals who are not		
2	full-time farmers or ranchers, but who grow food or other		
3	agricultural products for their own use or for small-scale sale		
4	may be targets of agricultural product theft and vandalism.		
5	This theft and vandalism dispossesses victims of food they have		
6	grown, deprives them of a source of income, and reduces their		
7	self-sufficiency.		
8	The purpose of this Act is to establish a two-year		
9	agricultural theft and vandalism pilot project to examine the		
10	effectiveness of prosecuting agricultural theft and vandalism		
11	cases, including theft and vandalism affecting individuals who		
12	are not full-time farmers or ranchers, in the county of Hawaii.		
13	SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture shall:		
14	(1) Establi	sh a two-year agricultural theft and vandalism	
15	pilot p	roject to examine and assess the effectiveness	
16	of pros	ecuting agricultural theft and agricultural	
17	vandali	sm cases in the county of Hawaii;	
18	(2) Examine	and assess the effectiveness of prosecuting	
19	the the	ft of agricultural products produced for	
20	persona	l or small-scale commercial use on any land,	
21	regardl	ess of land classification;	

1	(3)	Partner with the county of Hawaii to hire two	
2		enforcement officers within the prosecuting atto	rney's
3		office or any other law enforcement agency; and	
4	(4)	No later than January 1, 2020, assess the	
5		implementation of the pilot project, including t	he
6		pilot project's effectiveness in:	
7		(A) Identifying the number of convictions for	
8		agricultural theft and agricultural vandali	sm;
9		(B) Identifying best practices for prosecuting	
10		perpetrators of agricultural theft and	
11		agricultural vandalism;	
12		(C) Identifying areas where agricultural theft	and
13		agricultural vandalism are most prevalent;	
14		(D) Identifying best practices for preventing	
15		agricultural theft and agricultural vandali	sm;
16		and	
17		(E) Making recommendations for a statewide prog	ram to
18		address agricultural theft and agricultural	
19		vandalism.	
20	(b)	Based on the department of agriculture's assessm	ent of
21	the agric	ltural theft and vandalism pilot project, the	

- 1 department shall determine whether to continue, expand, or end
- 2 the pilot project.
- 3 (c) The department of agriculture shall submit a report of
- 4 its findings and recommendations, including any proposed
- 5 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 6 to the convening of the regular session of 2020.
- 7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 10 purposes of establishing and implementing a two-year
- 11 agricultural theft and vandalism pilot project including the
- 12 hiring of two full-time equivalent enforcement officers (2.0
- 13 FTE) for the pilot project.
- 14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 15 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
