A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the transportation 2 of fireworks to, from, and within the State requires the 3 utilization of multiple modes or methods of transport, 4 including, but not limited to, interstate maritime 5 transportation and intrastate trucking. The legislature also 6 finds that, given the diversity of transportation processes and 7 modes, it is essential to, and in the best interest of, the 8 health and safety of first responders that the importation of 9 fireworks shipments be thoroughly accounted for and reported. 10 The legislature further finds that Hawaii's fireworks law 11 provides requirements under section 132D-8.6, Hawaii Revised 12 Statutes, for licensed individuals or entities that ship 13 fireworks. However, the legislature acknowledges that, while 14 the definition of "shipper" was added to section 132D-2, Hawaii 15 Revised Statutes, pursuant to Act 127, Session Laws of Hawaii 16 2011, the requirements for shippers were inadvertently omitted

from the Hawaii Revised Statutes. The legislature therefore



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1 finds that to ensure a more comprehensive tracking of all 2 shipments of fireworks imported into the State, additional 3 requirements regarding those persons and entities defined as 4 "shippers" are necessary.

5 The legislature also finds it reasonable to authorize
6 certain acts regarding fireworks, and necessary to clarify a
7 labeling requirement regarding certain fireworks.

8 The purpose of this Act is to amend current state fireworks
9 law by:

- 10 (1) Delineating the responsibilities of those persons and
 11 entities defined as "shippers";
- 12 (2) Authorizing the use of fireworks, by permit, for film13 and movie productions;

14 (3) Authorizing the testing, disposal, and destruction of
15 illegal and unwanted fireworks by law enforcement; and
16 (4) Correcting labeling dimensions with regard to display
17 fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, or aerial devices
18 used for a display.

19 SECTION 2. Chapter 132D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
21 and to read as follows:



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1	" <u>§</u> 13:	2D- Requirements for shippers. Any shipper that
2	receives	fireworks that are imported into the State or
3	transport	ed between counties, before shipment, shall notify the
4	county fi	re chief of the county to which the shipment is
5	destined a	as to whether the shipment will be distributed from:
6	(1)	Pier to pier;
7	(2)	Pier to warehouse or storage facility; or
8	(3)	Pier to redistribution."
9	SECT:	ION 3. Section 132D-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended to	o read as follows:
11	"[-[]]	§132D-6[] Exceptions. The prohibitions in section
12	132D-5 do	not apply to:
13	(1)	The use of flares, noisemakers, or signals for
14		warning, pest control, or illumination purposes by
15		police and fire departments, utility companies,
16		transportation agencies, and other governmental or
17		private agencies or persons, including agricultural
18		operations, in connection with emergencies, their
19		duties, or business; [and]



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1	(2)	The sale or use of blank cartridges for a show or	
2		theater, or for signal, commercial, or institutional	
3		purposes in athletics or sports[-];	
4	(3)	The purchase and use of consumer fireworks, aerial	
5		devices, display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic in	
6		a film or movie production with a valid permit issued	
7		by a county pursuant to section 132D-10; and	
8	(4)	The testing, disposal, or destruction of illegal or	
9		unwanted fireworks by an authority having	
10		jurisdiction, which shall be an agency responsible for	
11		enforcing this chapter."	
12	SECTION 4. Section 132D-16.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
13	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		
14	"(b) Each shell, mine, comet, and multiple tube device,		
15	such as finale or barrage boxes, roman candle batteries, or		
16	cakes, shall bear a permanent label listing the licensee's name,		
17	address, and contact information to include telephone number or		
18	electronic mail address. The label shall also list the name and		
19	business address of the manufacturer. The label shall be		
20	approved by the state fire council and conform to the following		
21	standards:		



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1 Numerals and letters of the printed matter shall be (1) 2 not less than one-eighth of an inch high; Required statements shall be printed in a color that 3 (2) 4 contrasts sharply with the background and shall be printed within a borderline; and 5 6 The label shall measure at least nine [inches by nine] (3) 7 square inches; provided that if the size of the shell, 8 mine, comet, or multiple tube device is too small to 9 correctly display a label of this size, the label may 10 be reduced to a size no smaller than necessary to 11 properly display the information described in this section." 12 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 14 This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 15 SECTION 6. 16
