# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPEECH PATHOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1       SECTION 1. Chapter 468E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated  
3 and to read as follows:

4       "§468E-       Provisional license. (a) The board shall  
5 grant, upon application and payment of proper fees, provisional  
6 licensure to an individual who:

7       (1) Possesses at a minimum a bachelor's degree or its  
8 equivalent and a master's degree or its equivalent in  
9 the area of speech pathology from an educational  
10 institution recognized by the board; and

11       (2) Engages in clinical or academic practice under the  
12 supervision of a licensed speech pathologist for such  
13 period of time as needed to fulfill the necessary  
14 requirements for a professional license as a speech  
15 pathologist pursuant to section 468E-5.

16       (b) Each provisional license shall include the name and  
17 title of a speech pathologist who is licensed, is in good



1 standing, and will supervise the provisional licensee. A  
2 provisional licensee may practice speech pathology only under  
3 the supervision of the licensed speech pathologist named on the  
4 provisional license.

5 (c) A provisional license shall be valid for one year from  
6 the date of issuance and may be renewed for additional one year  
7 periods as needed to fulfill the requirements for professional  
8 licensure as a speech pathologist pursuant to section 468E-5.

9 (d) The board shall determine by rule the amount of the  
10 provisional license fee."

11 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.


12 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
