A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that agricultural theft

2 and agricultural vandalism are constant worries for farmers and

3 ranchers. Given the broad acreage that many farming operations

encompass, it is often difficult for farmers to police their

5 entire operations at all times. Furthermore, vigilance at night

6 after work hours may be challenging because not all farmers and

7 ranchers are able to live on or near the fields where they work.

8 All of these factors make agricultural operations easy prey for

9 theft and vandalism.

10 The legislature also finds that the county of Hawaii is

known as the breadbasket of the State. Agricultural theft and

12 agricultural vandalism have been a constant threat for farmers

13 and ranchers on the island, increasing the cost of production

14 and making it more difficult for farming operations to be

15 successful.

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16 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of

17 agriculture to establish a two-year agricultural theft pilot

13		(A)	Identifying the number of convictions for

16			perpetrators of agricultural theft and
17			agricultural vandalism;
18		(C)	Identifying areas where agricultural theft and
19			agricultural vandalism are most prevalent;

1	(D)	Identifying best practices for preventing	
2		agricultural theft and agricultural vandalism;

4	(E)	Making recommendations for a statewide program to	
5		address agricultural theft and agricultural	
6		vandalism.	
7	(b) Base	d on the department of agriculture's assessment of	
8	the agricultur	al theft pilot project, the department shall	
9	determine whet	her to continue, expand, or end the pilot project.	
10	(c) The	department of agriculture shall submit a report of	
11	its findings a	nd recommendations, including any proposed	
12	legislation, t	o the legislature no later than December 31, 2019.	
13	SECTION 3	. There is appropriated out of the general	
14	revenues of th	e State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much	
15	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 as a		
16	grant-in-aid to the office of the prosecuting attorney, county		
17	of Hawaii to a	ssist the department of agriculture in	
18	implementing a	two-year agricultural theft pilot project.	
19	The sum a	ppropriated shall be expended by the department of	
20	agriculture fo	r the purposes of this Act.	
21	SECTION 4	. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.

Agricultural Theft Pilot Project; Appropriation

Description:

Requires the department of agriculture to establish a two-year agricultural theft pilot project to focus on investigating and prosecuting agricultural theft and agricultural vandalism in the county of Hawaii. Appropriates funds as a grant-in-aid to the office of the prosecuting attorney, county of Hawaii, to assist in implementing the pilot project. (SD1)

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
