#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FERAL CATS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that feral cats are non-2 domesticated cats that typically live outdoors in colonies with 3 The fact that feral cats have not been other feral cats. 4 socialized to interact with humans makes it impractical to place 5 them into adoptive homes. Feral cat colonies create numerous 6 problems for the cats themselves, as well for as the communities 7 that find their presence to be a nuisance.

8 The legislature also finds that feral cats can reproduce at 9 an alarming rate. It is estimated that one unspayed female cat 10 and her unaltered offspring can produce more than four hundred 11 thousand cats within seven years. Although counties may attempt 12 to control the feral cat population by euthanizing feral cats, euthanasia does not address the problem of exponential increases 13 14 in the cat population. When cats from a colony are euthanized, 15 they leave a vacuum that is filled when other unsterilized cats 16 enter the same colony and start reproducing.

1 The legislature further finds that the trap-sterilize-2 return process is not only more humane than euthanization, but 3 less costly. In the trap-sterilize-return process, feral cats 4 are caught in humane traps, sterilized so that they can no longer reproduce, and surgically ear-tipped or ear-notched on 5 one ear so that they may be easily identified as sterilized. 6 7 The process may also include removing fleas and vaccinating the 8 cats. When these sterilized cats are returned to their 9 colonies, unsterilized cats are less likely to take their place. 10 Thus, with the trap-sterilize-return process, colony populations 11 can reduce gradually over time. The purpose of this Act is to promote the humane treatment 12 13 of feral cats by: 14 (1) Requiring the department of health to contract with a nonprofit animal rescue group to oversee caretakers of 15 16 feral cats; 17 (2) Exempting registered caretakers of feral cats from state and county laws relating to the feeding and 18 19 confinement of cats; provided that the caretakers are 20 registered with the contracted rescue group; and Establishing a trap-sterilize-return process. 21 (3)



1	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER

6	<b>§ -1 Definitions.</b> As used in this chapter, unless the
7	context clearly requires otherwise:
8	"Caretaker" means a person who provides or attempts to
9	provide food and care to one or more feral cats within the
10	State.
11	"Colony" means a group of feral cats that congregate and
12	live together at a location within the State.
13	"Contracted rescue group" means the rescue group that has
14	entered into a contract with the department of health pursuant
15	to this chapter.
16	"Feral cat" means a cat that is not:
17	(1) Owned by any person, or has been abandoned by its
18	owner; and
19	(2) Confined by any person to any real property.
20	"Registered caretaker" means a person who is registered as
21	a caretaker pursuant to this chapter.

1 "Rescue group" means a society or organization that: 2 (1)Is incorporated and in good standing as a nonprofit 3 corporation pursuant to chapter 414D; 4 (2) Is incorporated for the purpose of providing shelter 5 to animals, promoting animal welfare, preventing 6 cruelty to animals, or a substantially similar 7 purpose; 8 (3) Euthanizes or arranges to euthanize an animal only 9 when a licensed veterinarian determines that: 10 (A) The animal is suffering from an injury, terminal 11 illness, or other health problem that severely 12 affects the animal's quality of life; and 13 (B) Euthanization is necessary to alleviate the 14 animal's suffering; and 15 (4) Is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as a tax 16 exempt organization under section 501(c)(3) of the 17 Internal Revenue Code. 18 "Trap-sterilize-return process" means a process that 19 includes capturing a feral cat, arranging for its sterilization, 20 complying with other applicable standards, and subsequently 21 releasing the cat.
