A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

Section 134-7.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 SECTION 1. 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: Any person disgualified from ownership, possession, 3 "(b) or control of firearms and ammunition under section 134-7, 4 5 within seven days of disqualification, shall voluntarily 6 surrender all firearms and ammunition to the chief of police where the person resides or dispose of all firearms and 7 8 ammunition. If any person fails to voluntarily surrender or dispose of all firearms and ammunition within [thirty] seven 9 days from the date of disqualification, the chief of police may 10 11 seize all firearms and ammunition."

SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun before its effective date.

15 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.

Firearms; Ammunition; Disqualification; Voluntary Surrender

Description:

Requires voluntary surrender of firearms and ammunition, upon disqualification from ownership, possession, or control, within seven days of disqualification. Shortens the time period after failing to voluntarily surrender or dispose of all firearms and ammunition upon disqualification, after which the chief of police may seize all firearms and ammunition, from thirty days to seven days. (CD1)
