A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELEVATOR MECHANICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that elevators are one of
- 2 the safest modes of transportation. There are an estimated
- 3 eighteen billion elevator trips taken per year in the United
- 4 States. With the continued vertical growth of urban Honolulu,
- 5 including some condominium developments that exceed forty
- 6 floors, it is important for Hawaii to ensure that state laws
- 7 governing repair and maintenance of elevators remain current.
- 8 The legislature notes that the elevator mechanics' statute,
- 9 chapter 448H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, has not been updated in
- 10 more than ten years.
- 11 The legislature further finds that, like many other
- 12 sectors, the elevator industry is undergoing rapid technological
- 13 advancements, which require elevator mechanics to expand their
- 14 knowledge and skills through training and education to ensure
- 15 that licensing standards and core competencies are met. Given
- 16 these technological advancements, it is necessary for elevator
- 17 mechanics to demonstrate core competencies when installing,



- 1 repairing, and maintaining all elevators, escalators, and other
- 2 vertical transportation.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to strengthen regulatory
- 4 oversight of the licensed profession of elevator mechanics by
- 5 amending the permissible scope of work, apprenticeship and
- 6 licensing requirements, and remote interaction requirements.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 448H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding five new sections to be appropriately
- 9 designated and to read as follows:
- 10 "§448H-A Examination. Every applicant shall pass an
- 11 examination prescribed by the board for licensure. Every
- 12 applicant shall:
- 13 (1) Pass the examination with no less than seventy per
- 14 cent correct; and
- 15 (2) Not be allowed to review any of the applicant's failed
- examinations.
- 17 §448H-B License renewals; continuing education. (a)
- 18 Licenses shall expire on June 30 of each even-numbered year.
- 19 Licensees seeking renewal shall pay all applicable fees and
- 20 complete the continuing education requirements pursuant to
- 21 subsection (b).

1	(b)	Prior to each license renewal, all licensed elevator
2	mechanics	shall complete:
3	(1)	An educational course, approved by the board, of no
4		less than eight hours related to the elevator
5		industry; or
6	(2)	A qualified elevator inspector continuing education
7		course of no less than eight hours offered by an
8		American National Standards Institute accredited
9		certifying organization.
10	<u>(c)</u>	An elevator mechanic initially licensed within one
11	year prio	r to the applicable renewal date shall not be required
12	to complet	te the eight hours of continuing education to renew the
13	elevator m	mechanic's license.
14	(d)	The board may conduct random audits to determine
15	compliance	e with the continuing education requirement. The board
16	shall prov	vide written notice of an audit to a licensee randomly
17	selected :	for audit. Within sixty days of notification, the
18	licensee s	shall provide the board documentation verifying
19	compliance	e with the continuing education requirement established
20	by this se	ection.

1	§448H-C Elevator mechanics scope of work. All
2	construction; reconstruction; alteration, including flooring;
3	and all elevator cab work, maintenance, repair, troubleshooting,
4	mechanical, or electrical work or adjustments, which includes
5	but is not limited to updating software, changing parameters,
6	resetting faults, and operation of all systems and functions,
7	shall be performed by a licensed elevator mechanic. Work on
8	adjustment of the structure or facility, of which the conveyance
9	may be part or to which the conveyance may be attached,
10	including any construction; reconstruction; alteration,
11	including flooring; and all elevator cab work necessary for
12	proper completion of the work on the conveyance shall be
13	performed by a licensed elevator mechanic.
14	§448H-D Exemptions. Licensure as an elevator mechanic
15	shall not be required for:
16	(1) Dismantling or removing a conveyance; provided that
17	the conveyance will not be reused and the building or
18	structure, as defined by its foundation outline, is
19	totally secure from public and unauthorized access and
20	the entire building is being completely demolished
21	down to and including the foundation; and

1	(2)	Employees of an elevator contractor duly licensed
2		under chapter 444 who enters into the contract to
3		install, repair, or remove the platform lift or
4		stairway lift within a private residence not
5		accessible to the general public or to other occupants
6		in the building.
7	<u>§448</u>	H-E Remote interaction. Remote interaction of a
8	conveyanc	e shall not be permitted without the express permission
9	of a lice	nsed elevator mechanic who shall be physically present
10	at the co	nveyance; provided that this section shall not preclude
11	remote in	teraction with the conveyance from within the building
12	or comple	x in which the conveyance is located if the interaction
13	is for th	e sole purpose of securing, locking, or providing
14	private u	se of the conveyance."
15	SECT	ION 3. Section 448H-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended a	s follows:
17	1.	By adding two new definitions to be appropriately
18	inserted	and to read:
19	" <u>"Co</u>	nveyance" means any elevator, dumbwaiter, stage lift,
20	mechanize	d parking garage elevator, escalator, moving walk or
21	ramp, or	lift.

- 4 2. By amending the definition of "apprentice elevator
- 5 mechanic" to read:
- 6 ""Apprentice elevator mechanic" means any person who is
- 7 [in] enrolled in an apprenticeship program for the elevator
- 8 industry registered with a state apprenticeship counsel or the
- 9 Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, United States Department
- 10 of Labor, is actively training to acquire the skill to become an
- 11 elevator mechanic, and who is required to work for [at least
- 12 four years] no less than four and one half years full time or
- 13 its equivalent, but no less than nine thousand hours under the
- 14 supervision of an elevator mechanic duly licensed under section
- **15** 448H-6."
- 3. By amending the definition of "elevator mechanic" to
- 17 read:
- ""Elevator mechanic" means any person who engages in the
- 19 construction, reconstruction, alteration, maintenance, repair,
- 20 troubleshooting, mechanical, or electrical work or adjustments,
- 21 which includes but is not limited to updating software, changing

1 parameters, resetting faults, and the operation of all systems 2 and functions, of any [elevator, dumbwaiter, stage lift, 3 mechanized parking garage elevator, escalator, moving walk or 4 ramp, lift] conveyance including any construction, 5 reconstruction, alteration, or adjustment of the structure or 6 facility of which the same may be a part or to which the same 7 may be attached, necessary for proper completion of the work on 8 the [elevator, dumbwaiter, stage lift, mechanized parking garage 9 elevator, escalator, moving walk or ramp, or lift.] conveyance." 10 SECTION 4. Section 448H-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "§448H-5 Powers and duties of the board. In addition to 13 any other powers and duties authorized by law, the board shall: 14 (1) Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 to carry out 15 the purposes of this chapter; 16 (2) Develop, apply, review and upgrade appropriate 17 techniques, including examinations and investigations 18 for determining whether a person meets the 19 requirements of this chapter and standards to insure 20 that elevator mechanics will be persons qualified to 21

4		regarding job performance by mechanics, the rules of
5		the board, or chapter 397 and the rules adopted
6		thereunder;
7	[-(7)	Register apprentice elevator mechanics;
8	(8)]	(7) Maintain a record of its proceedings;
9	[-(9) -]	(8) Assist and advise the department of labor and
10		industrial relations in the adoption of rules relating
11		to the conditions of work for elevator mechanics
12		including requirements related to equipment or
13		facilities essential for the safe installation,
14		repair, maintenance, or alteration of any [elevator,
15		<pre>dumbwaiter, escalator, moving walk or ramp, and lift;</pre>
16		conveyance; and
17	[(10)]	(9) Notify the department of labor and industrial
18		relations of any fact or situation that, in the
19		opinion of the board, constitutes a violation of
20		chapter 397 or of any rule adopted thereunder."

1	SECT	ION 5. Section 448H-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended t	o read as follows:
3	"§44	8H-6 Qualifications for license. No person shall be
4	licensed	as an elevator mechanic unless the person has
5	satisfact	orily passed the examination administered by the board
6	and [sati	sfactorily completed at least four years of training
7	under the	supervision of a licensed elevator mechanic.] has met
8	the follo	wing minimum qualifications:
9	(1)	Obtained a certificate of completion from an
10		apprenticeship program for the elevator industry
11		registered with a state apprenticeship counsel or the
12		Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training, United States
13		Department of Labor, approved by the board with
14		standards similar to but no less than those set forth
15		by the National Elevator Industry Educational Program,
16		and
17	(2)	Satisfactorily completed no less than four and one-
18		half years full time work or its equivalent, but no
19		less than nine thousand hours, under the direct
20		supervision of an elevator mechanic duly licensed
21		under this section. The board shall, by rule,

1		establish the terms for the verification of time in
2		the industry."
3	SECT	ION 6. Section 448H-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to	o read as follows:
5	"§44	8H-7 Temporary permit. The board may issue a
6	temporary	permit to [any] the following:
7	(1)	Any person who has qualified as an elevator mechanic
8		in another state with standards substantially equal to
9		those of this chapter and who possesses skills or
10		training not available in the State[+ provided that
11		the board shall not register any such person as an
12		apprentice elevator mechanic]. The board shall, by
13		[rules and regulations,] rule, establish the terms of
14		the temporary permit[-]; and
15	(2)	An apprentice elevator mechanic who has a minimum of
16		three years full time work experience, but no less
17		than six thousand hours, under the direct supervision
18		of an elevator mechanic duly licensed under section
19		448H-6, if there is a shortage of elevator mechanics
20		in the State. The board shall, by rule, establish the
21		terms for the determination of a shortage of elevator

- 1 mechanics, the verification of time in the industry,
- 2 and the terms of the apprentice's temporary permit."
- 3 SECTION 7. Section 448H-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "\$448H-8 Fees. Application, examination, license,
- 6 temporary permit, and biennial renewal fees shall be as provided
- 7 in rules adopted by the director of commerce and consumer
- 8 affairs pursuant to chapter 91. A fee is required for each
- 9 reexamination. Application fees are not refundable.
- 10 [Licenses shall expire on June 30 of each even-numbered
- 11 year.]"
- 12 SECTION 8. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 13 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 14 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 15 the new sections in this Act.
- 16 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018;
- 19 provided that section 448H-B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as added
- 20 by section 2 of this Act, and section 5 of this Act shall take
- 21 effect on July 1, 2020.
