### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 health, developmental disabilities division operates the 3 medicaid intellectual and developmental disabilities home and 4 community based services waiver, also known as the HCBS I/DD 5 waiver, on behalf of the Department of Health and Human 6 Services, MedQuest division. The HCBS I/DD waiver is provided 7 under section 1915(c) of the Social Security Act. The HCBS I/DD 8 waiver is reviewed and approved by the Centers for Medicare and 9 Medicaid Services and has many requirements to ensure the 10 appropriate and efficient provision of services and supports to 11 people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

12 The legislature further finds that, for children who 13 qualify for a HCBS I/DD waiver who have an autism spectrum 14 disorder, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services has 15 clarified that, per section 1905(a) of the Social Security Act, 16 services "recommended by a physician or other licensed 17 practitioner of the healing arts" for the treatment of autism



1 spectrum disorders must be provided through the child's medicaid 2 health plan through the early and periodic screening, 3 diagnostic, and treatment benefit, and cannot be provided as a 4 HCBS I/DD waiver service. This leaves a gap in coverage for 5 children with autism spectrum disorders who would be best served 6 under the HCBS I/DD waiver; this gap could be filled by 7 professionals who are exempt from behavior analyst licensure 8 requirements, who would fall outside the scope of the section 9 1905(a) requirement, which would let home-based applied behavior 10 analysis fall within the broad scope of the HCBS I/DD waiver. 11 The legislature further finds that the Centers for Medicare 12 and Medicaid Services requires the states to provide participant 13 safeguards that ensure the health, safety and rights of HCBS 14 I/DD waiver participants. The developmental disabilities 15 division has policies and procedures to ensure positive behavior 16 supports are used to proactively minimize challenging behaviors, 17 and to limit the use of restrictive procedures. The 18 developmental disabilities division conducts oversight and 19 continuous quality assurance to ensure safe and appropriate 20 practices including a behavioral review committee to review

quality of care for individuals who need supports to learn new
 behaviors.

3 The legislature also finds that there is confusion in the 4 community as to the scope of the behavior analyst profession. 5 Different professionals use different titles and different 6 terminology to refer to themselves and what they do. The 7 legislature further finds that this confusion may be increased 8 based on the proposed expansion of waivers for licensing. 9 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to: 10 (1) Allow children with autism spectrum disorders to 11 receive appropriate applied behavior analysis 12 treatment, while simultaneously providing safeguards 13 for consumer protection; 14 (2) Exempt from the licensure requirement for behavior 15 analysis certain individuals who implement applied 16 behavior analysis services or plans under the 17 oversight of a behavioral review committee or 18 psychologist; and 19 (3) Update and standardize the terminology used to refer 20 to behavior analysts.

1 SECTION 2. Section 465D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§465D-7 Exemptions. (a) This chapter is not intended to restrict the practice of other licensed or credentialed 4 5 practitioners practicing within their own recognized scopes of 6 practice and shall not apply to: (1) An individual working within the scope of practice or 7 duties of another licensed profession that overlaps 8 9 with the practice of applied behavior analysis; 10 provided that the person does not purport to be a 11 licensed behavior analyst; (2) An individual who implements or designs applied 12 13 behavior analysis services and possesses board 14 certification as an assistant behavior analyst by the 15 Behavior Analyst Certification Board and who practices 16 in accordance with the most recent supervisory and 17 ethical requirements adopted by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board under the direction of a behavior 18 19 analyst licensed in this State; 20 (3) An individual who designs or implements applied 21 behavior analysis services to participants in the

Sections 465D-2, 465D-4, 465D-5, and 465D-11, 18 Hawaii Revised Statutes, are amended by substituting the phrase 19 "practice of applied behavior analysis" wherever the phrase 20 "practice of behavior analysis" appears, as the context 21 requires.



SECTION 4. Section 465D-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by substituting the phrase "applied behavior analysis"
 wherever the phrase "behavior analysis" appears, as the context
 requires.

5 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

7 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
