A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHAPTER 453, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that one of the goals of
medical licensure should be to establish access to quality
medical care and overcome geographic barriers.

4 The legislature further finds that additional barriers such 5 as availability and access may exist which can impede licensure 6 in Hawaii of qualified physicians, surgeons, and osteopathic 7 physicians. The legislature additionally finds that licensure 8 by endorsement will provide an expedited and efficient process 9 for a qualified physician, surgeon, or osteopathic physician to 10 become licensed and provide quality medical care in Hawaii.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish requirements for the licensure by endorsement of physicians, surgeons, and osteopathic physicians to practice in Hawaii.

SECTION 2. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

5	determining the applicant's ability to safely and competently			
6	engage in the practice of medicine."			
7	SECTION 3. The department of commerce and consumer affairs			
8	may employ necessary personnel without regard to chapter 76,			
9	Hawaii Revised Statutes, to assist with the implementation and			
10	continuing functions of this Act.			
11	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the compliance			
12	resolution fund established pursuant to section 26-9(o), Hawaii			
13	Revised Statutes, the sum of \$104,000 or so much thereof as may			
14	be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for purposes of			
15	implementing this Act.			
16	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of			
17	commerce and consumer affairs for the purposes of this Act.			
18	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.			
19	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018;			
20	provided that section 2 shall take effect on December 31, 2018.
