### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINORS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 S	SECTION	1.	The	legislature	finds	that	the	American
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- 2 Psychological Association convened a task force on appropriate
- 3 therapeutic responses to sexual orientation. The task force
- conducted a systematic review of peer-reviewed journal 4
- literature on sexual orientation change efforts. The task force 5
- 6 concluded that sexual orientation change efforts are unlikely to
- 7 be successful and involve risk of harm to lesbian, gay, and
- bisexual individuals, including depression, suicidality, loss of 8
- 9 sexual feeling, anxiety, shame, negative self-image, and other
- negative feelings and behaviors. The legislature further finds 10
- that children and adolescents who participate in these types of 11
- sexual orientation change efforts, which often use fear-based 12
- techniques, are given inaccurate scientific information 13
- regarding sexual orientation and gender identity and are also at 14
- 15 risk of increased self-stigma and psychological distress.
- The legislature additionally finds that sexual orientation 16
- change efforts are opposed by the country's leading medical and 17



- 1 mental health professional organizations, including the American
- 2 Psychological Association, American Medical Association,
- 3 American Academy of Pediatrics, American Psychiatric
- 4 Association, National Association of Social Workers, American
- 5 College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, and American Academy
- 6 of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to:
- Protect the physical and psychological well-being of 8 (1) 9 minors, including lesbian, gay, bisexual, and **10** transgender youth, against exposure to serious harms caused by sexual orientation change efforts by 11 regulating the conduct of specific state-licensed 12 13 persons who provide professional counseling to minors under the age of eighteen and prohibiting these 14 15 professionals from engaging in, attempting to engage 16 in, or advertising the offering of sexual orientation change efforts on persons under eighteen years of age; 17 18 and
  - (2) Establish the sexual orientation counseling task force to address the concerns of minors seeking counseling

"Advertise" means a communication made by or on behalf of a 1 person who is licensed to provide professional counseling, made 2 3 for the purpose of inducing or promoting a professional counseling relationship in which sexual orientation change 4 efforts will be undertaken on a person under the age of 5 "Advertise" includes oral, written, graphic, or 6 7 pictorial statements or representations, including those made 8 through any electronic or print medium. 9 "Person who is licensed to provide professional counseling" means a person who performs counseling as part of the person's 10 11 professional training, including a physician, especially one 12 practicing psychiatry, licensed pursuant to chapter 453; psychologist licensed pursuant to chapter 465; nurse licensed 13 14 pursuant to chapter 457; social worker licensed pursuant to chapter 467E; licensed mental health counselor licensed pursuant 15 16 to chapter 453D; or licensed marriage and family therapist **17** licensed pursuant to chapter 451J. "Sexual orientation change efforts" means the practice of 18 19 attempting to change a person's sexual orientation, including but not limited to efforts to change gender identity or gender 20

expressions and behaviors; or to reduce or eliminate sexual or

- 3 "Sexual orientation change efforts" shall not include
- 4 counseling supporting a person seeking to transition from one
- 5 gender to another or counseling that:
- 6 (1) Provides acceptance, support, and understanding of a
- 7 person or facilitates a person's coping, social
- 8 support, and identity exploration and development,
- 9 including sexual orientation-neutral interventions to
- 10 prevent or address unlawful conduct or unsafe sexual

- 14 SECTION 3. (a) There is established within the department
- 15 of health, the sexual orientation counseling task force. The
- 16 task force shall address the concerns of minors seeking

- 18 expressions, and related behaviors. The task force shall submit
- 19 a report with findings and recommendations, including proposed
- 20 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior

- (1) Current counseling practices in Hawaii and nationwide
   for minors, including counseling on sexual

  9 counseling for minors on issues regarding sexual
  10 orientation, gender identity, gender expression, and

- 15 (4) Proposed legislation to provide accessible and

  20 shall be the chair of the sexual orientation counseling task

- 4 SECTION 5. If any provision of this Act, or the

#### Report Title:

Sexual Orientation Change Efforts; Conversion Therapy; Prohibition; Minors; Licensed Professionals; Sexual Orientation Counseling Task Force

#### Description:

Prohibits specific state-licensed persons who are licensed to provide professional counseling from engaging in, attempting to engage in, or advertising sexual orientation change efforts on minors. Establishes the sexual orientation counseling task force to address the concerns of minors seeking counseling on sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expressions, and related behaviors. (CD1)

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
