A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COFFEE BERRY BORER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014,
- 2 established a pesticides subsidy program in the department of
- 3 agriculture for five years to assist coffee growers with
- 4 offsetting the costs of purchasing certain pesticides known to
- 5 be effective against the coffee berry borer, a highly
- 6 destructive coffee pest that has infested coffee crops on Hawaii
- 7 island, and more recently has been detected on Oahu and Maui.
- 8 Act 152, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, established a
- 9 pesticide subsidy program manager position as a full-time,
- 10 temporary position exempt from chapter 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised
- 11 Statutes. Section 76-16(b)(17), Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 12 provides that any exemption created after July 1, 2014, shall
- 13 expire three years after its enactment unless affirmatively
- 14 extended by an act of the legislature. Pursuant to section 76-
- 15 16(b)(17), the exemption from civil service of the pesticide
- 16 subsidy program manager position will expire on June 30, 2018,
- 17 three years after it was created by Act 152, Session Laws of
- 18 Hawaii 2015.

1 Because it took longer than anticipated for Act 105 to be implemented, Act 65, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, extended the 2 pesticide subsidy program from its original sunset date of June 3 30, 2019, to a new sunset date of June 30, 2021, to assist 4 5 coffee growers for the number of years intended when Act 105 was enacted. However, Act 65 did not extend the civil service 6 7 exemption of pesticide subsidy program manager position. Pursuant to section 3[©] of Act 105, to be eliqible for 8 9 subsidy, applications for subsidy for pesticide purchases made in a fiscal year must be filed in the immediately following **10** fiscal year. For pesticide purchases made in the last fiscal 11 **12** year of the program, from July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, 13 applications for subsidy must be filed in the immediately 14 following fiscal year, anytime between July 1, 2021, and July 2022. The manager position will be needed to process these 15 applications for subsidies for costs incurred in the final year 16 of the program. **17** The purpose of this Act is to extend the civil service 18 exemption of the pesticide subsidy program manager position to 19 20 correspond with the extension of the program pursuant to Act 65 and to further extend the exemption of that position through 21

the fiscal year immediately following the program sunset date in

- 11 shall possess a requisite level of knowledge and expertise in

- available subsidy funds; and
- 16 (2) Manage the day-to-day coordination for the pesticide

- 18 The pesticide subsidy program manager shall receive a salary of
- 19 not more than \$50,000 per year. The pesticide subsidy program
- 20 manager position shall expire on June 30, 2022."

Report Title:

Coffee Berry Borer; Pesticide Subsidy Program Manager Position

Description:

Extending through the June 30, 2022, the exemption from chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, of the pesticide subsidy program manager position in order to provide assistance to local coffee farmers for pesticide costs incurred through the final year of the program.

PURPOSE:

To extend the pesticide subsidy program manager position to correspond to the two-year extension of the program by Act 65, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, and to continue the position for a year beyond the program sunset date in order to process applications for subsidies for costs incurred in the

final year of the program.

MEANS:

Amend section 3(g) of Act 105, SLH 2014, as amended by Act 152, SLH 2015, and Act 65, SLH 2017.

JUSTIFICATION:

The civil service exemption of the pesticide subsidy program manager position exempt from chapter 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that was established after July 1, 2014, will expire 3 years after its establishment by Act 152, Session Laws of Hawaii (SLH) 2015, on June 30, 2018, unless the exemption is affirmatively extended by legislative The civil service exemption of the program manager position, which is responsible for division and distribution of available subsidy funds, needs to be extended to correspond to the new program sunset date of June 30, 2021, as extended by Act 65, SLH 2017, and for a year beyond that sunset date because of the particular requirement as to when applications for subsidy must be filed.

Pursuant to section 3(c) of Act 105, SLH 2014, to be eligible for subsidy, applications for subsidy for pesticide purchases made in a fiscal year must be filed in the immediately following fiscal

year. For pesticide purchases made in the last fiscal year of the program, from July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021, applications for subsidy must be filed in the immediately following fiscal year, anytime between July 1, 2021, and June 30, 2022. The manager position will be needed to process these applications for subsidies for costs incurred in the final year of the program, which is what Act 105 seems to have envisioned.
