RELATING TO SPECIAL DUTY FOR DEPUTY SHERIFFS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that deputy sheriffs
2	routinely serve the community by providing off-duty law
3	enforcement service, commonly known as "special duty" services,
4	for monetary compensation, to persons, organizations, and
5	government entities other than the state department of public
6	safety. Therefore, the legislature finds it is appropriate to
7	include statutory authorization for special duty employment by
8	deputy sheriffs.
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 353C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
11	and to read as follows:
12	" <u>\$353C-</u> Special duty employment: deputy sheriffs. (a)
13	Deputy sheriffs may engage in special duty employment.
14	"Special duty" means the performance of a service for a person,
15	organization, or governmental entity other than the department,
16	by a deputy sheriff of the sheriff division acting in a law
17	enforcement capacity while off-duty from the department, in

2	indirect payment or compensation of some kind.
3	(b) The department shall maintain, and revise when
4	necessary, policy and procedures to govern the processing of
5	requests for special duty and establish the compensation

7	sheriffs performing special duty work."
8	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SPECIAL DUTY FOR DEPUTY SHERIFFS.

PURPOSE: This bill provides statutory authorization for off-duty law enforcement services, commonly known as "special duty" services, for monetary compensation, to persons, organizations, and government entities other than the State Department of Public Safety.

MEANS: Add a new section to chapter 353C, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION: This bill will provide clarity by legislatively authorizing deputy sheriffs to provide off-duty law enforcement services, commonly known as "special duty" services, for monetary compensation to persons, organizations, and government entities other than the State Department of Public Safety. This bill requires the State Department of Public Safety to maintain, and revise when necessary, its policy and procedures governing special duty work.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Clarity will be provided to the Department of Public Safety, Sheriff Division, as it relates to special duty requests.
