## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 351-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) In the event any private citizen is injured or killed by any act or omission of any other person coming within the 4 criminal jurisdiction of the State after June 6, 1967, or any 5 state resident is injured or killed by any act or omission of 6 any other person after July 1, 1989, in another state, which act 7 or omission is within the description of the crimes enumerated 8 9 in section 351-32, or any resident of this State who is injured or killed by an act of terrorism occurring outside the United 10 States, as defined in title 18 United States Code section 2331, 11 the commission in its discretion, upon an application, may order 12 the payment of compensation in accordance with this chapter: 13 To or for the benefit of the victim; 14 (1)To any person responsible for the maintenance of the 15 (2)
