A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend part III of chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to include a new offense relating to intentionally or knowingly damaging property holding cultural or historical significance to Native Hawaiians.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 708-800, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 7 and to read as follows:
- ""Property of another holding cultural or historical
 significance to Native Hawaiians" means any property of another
 that is a tangible object, structure, or real property of
 cultural or historical significance to Native Hawaiians as
 determined by experts in traditional Native Hawaiian customs and

8	(2) Criminal property damage to property of another
9	holding historical significance to Native Hawaiians is a

11	(3) A person convicted under this section shall be
12	required to attend a mandatory training program on the
13	historical significance of certain property to Native Hawaiians.
14	The training program shall be a minimum of hours, and
15	shall be administered by .
16	(4) In addition to the training program pursuant to
17	subsection (3), a person convicted under this section who is a
18	public employee shall also be censured under rules adopted by
19	the department or agency that employs the public employee. For
20	the purposes of this section, "public employee" means any person
21	subject to chapter 78."

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
