A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION AND ADAPTION INITIATIVE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 225P-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§225P-3 Hawaii climate change mitigation and adaptation 4 commission; general functions, duties, and powers. (a) There 5 is established the Hawaii climate change mitigation and adaptation commission that shall be placed within the department 6 7 of land and natural resources for administrative purposes only. 8 (b) Coordination of the commission shall be headed jointly 9 by the chairperson of the board of land and natural resources, 10 or the chairperson's designee, and the director of the office of 11 planning, or the director's designee.

12 (c) The commission shall include the following members:
13 (1) The chairs of the standing committees of the
14 legislature with subject matter jurisdiction
15 encompassing environmental protection and land use;

2		resources or the chairperson's designee, who shall be
3		the co-chair of the commission;
4	(3)	The director of the office of planning or the
5		director's designee, who shall be the co-chair of the
6		commission;

9	(5)	The chairperson of the board of directors of the
10		Hawaii tourism authority or the chairperson's
11		designee;
12	(6)	The chairperson of the board of agriculture or the
13		chairperson's designee;
14	(7)	The chief executive officer of the office of Hawaiian
15		affairs or the officer's designee;
16	(8)	The chairperson of the Hawaiian homes commission or
17		the chairperson's designee;
18	(9)	The director of transportation or the director's
19		designee;
20	(10)	The director of health or the director's designee;

1	(11)	The adjutant general or the adjutant general's
2		designee;
3	(12)	The chairperson of the board of education or the
4		chairperson's designee;
5	(13)	The directors of each of the county planning
6		departments, or the directors' designees; and \Box
7	(14)	The manager of the coastal zone management program.
8	(d)	In addition to the members listed in subsection (c),
9	the chair	s of the commission may request the participation or
10	input of	members of the public; experts in the field; and
11	county, s	tate, or federal officials or others as necessary.
12	(e)	The members of the commission shall serve without pay
13	but shall	be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses,
14	including	travel expenses, incurred in carrying out their
15	duties.	
16	(f)	The commission shall provide policy direction,
17	facilitat	ion, coordination, and planning among state and county
18	agencies,	federal agencies, and other partners as appropriate.
19	(g)	The commission shall establish climate change
20	mitigatic	on and adaptation strategies and goals to help guide
21	planning	and implementation statewide using the latest



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1	scientific analysis and risk assessment to monitor and forecast
2	climate change related impacts at the regional, state, and local
3	level, including any additional information deemed necessary.
4	(h) The commission shall develop a science-based carbon
5	budget for Hawaii based on greenhouse gas analysis in the United
6	Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change Fifth
7	Assessment Report. The budget shall be based on equitable
8	sharing of the Earth's remaining allowable carbon emissions to
9	have at least a sixty-six per cent chance of limiting global
10	warming to below two degrees Celsius above pre-industrial
11	temperatures, in accordance with Act 32, Session Laws of Hawaii
12	2017. The commission may also develop individual carbon budgets
13	for Hawaii's major energy use sectors, including electricity
14	generation, ground transportation, and marine, aviation, and
15	industrial energy.
16	[(h)] <u>(i)</u> The commission shall identify vulnerable people,
17	communities, industries, ecosystems, and the potential economic
18	ramifications for climate change related impacts.
19	[(i)] <u>(j)</u> The commission shall identify existing climate
20	change mitigation and adaptation efforts at the federal, state,
21	and local levels and [make] shall:



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1	(1)	Make recommendations for how to meet or exceed
2		Hawaii's state mitigation goals [and shall adopt] <u>;</u>
3	(2)	Adopt a liberal approach in preparation, so as to
4		minimize future risk to the people and environment of
5		Hawaii[-] <u>; and</u>
6	(3)	Prioritize, identify, utilize, and maintain nature-
7		based solutions in its climate change mitigation and
8		adaptation efforts at the regional, state, and local
9		levels. For purposes of this paragraph, "nature-based
10		solutions" means actions that may work cooperatively
11		and in tandem with built and modified ecosystems to
12		protect, sustainably manage, and restore natural or
13		modified ecosystems or built ecosystems, where
14		appropriate and necessary, that address societal
15		challenges effectively and adaptively, while
16		simultaneously providing human well-being and
17		biodiversity benefits.
18	[(j)	-] (k) The commission shall assess the capacity and
19	availabil	ity of existing resources and identify new sources of
20	revenue n	necessary to address climate change mitigation and
21	adaptatic	on and shall advise the governor, legislature, and

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1 counties on the economic and budgetary ramifications of climate 2 change impacts, mitigation, and adaptation. $\left[\frac{k}{k}\right]$ (1) The commission shall identify the information 3 necessary to track progress in implementing climate change 4 mitigation and adaptation efforts and shall submit an annual 5 6 report to the governor and legislature no later than twenty days 7 prior to the convening of each regular session of the 8 legislature. 9 $\left[\frac{1}{1}\right]$ (m) The commission shall maintain a website that 10 includes a mission statement as well as access to climate change related actions, plans, policies, and results. 11 12 [(m)] (n) The commission shall conduct a comprehensive 13 review of the implementation as required by this section and 14 submit a report to the governor, legislature, and the counties 15 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular 16 session of 2023 and every five years thereafter. 17 [(n)] (o) The commission shall, as a first step, focus on and develop sea level rise vulnerability and adaptation reports 18 19 that shall include: Identification of the major areas of sea level rise 20 (1)

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impacts affecting the State and counties through 2050;

2		based on the latest scientific research for each area
3		through 2050;
4	(3)	Identification of the economic ramifications of sea
5		level rise;
6	(4)	Identification of applicable federal laws, policies,

9		adaptation for hazards associated with increasing sea
10		level rise.
11	The repor	ts shall be made publicly available no later than
12	December 31, 2017, and the commission shall reevaluate and	
13	update the sea level rise vulnerability and adaptation report	
14	every five years.

16	[(n),] <u>(o),</u> the commission shall:	
17	(1)	Solicit public views and concerns; and
18	(2)	Coordinate with the various county, state, and federal

Report Title:

Hawaii Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Initiative; Nature-Based Solutions; Science-Based Carbon Budget

Description:

Requires the Hawaii Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission to prioritize, identify, utilize, and maintain nature-based solutions in its climate change mitigation and adaptation efforts at the regional, state, and local levels. Clarifies "nature-based solutions". Requires the Commission to develop a science-based carbon budget for the State. (SB2965 HD1)

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
