## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO KUPUNA CARE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 102, Session 2 Laws of Hawaii 2017, authorized the executive office on aging to 3 establish the kupuna caregivers program to assist caregivers by 4 providing assistance to allow them to remain in the workforce 5 while their loved ones are provided with necessary support 6 services. The legislature further finds that the kupuna 7 caregivers program is critical to supporting the well-being of 8 caregivers who are sometimes elderly themselves, or who may need 9 to consider leaving their jobs or taking a significant cut in 10 pay to care for their parents. Hawaii's aging population 11 continues to grow, and caregiver assistance is critical to 12 supporting careqivers' own health as well as the health of 13 Hawaii's kupuna. Act 102, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, 14 appropriated \$600,000 for the initial establishment and 15 development of the program.

3 provided that the allocated funds shall be issued directly to 4 the service provider upon request and receipt of an invoice for 5 services rendered."

6 SECTION 4. The executive office on aging shall submit a 7 copy of the kupuna caregivers program plan, as required by 8 section 349-18(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes, to the legislature 9 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular 10 session of 2019.

SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$3,400,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the implementation of the kupuna caregivers program.

15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the executive 16 office on aging for the purposes of this Act.

17 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

19 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
