### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that traffic congestion
- 2 is a serious problem that negatively affects the quality of life
- 3 for residents and visitors in Hawaii. Congestion on the State's
- 4 roadways continues to increase, forcing people to spend more
- 5 time sitting in vehicles and less time being productive at work
- 6 or with families and friends.
- 7 The legislature also finds that visitors make up a large
- 8 proportion of public highway users. For example, visitors make
- 9 up about twenty-five per cent of Maui's population on any given
- 10 day. These visitors make up a sizeable proportion of those
- 11 using the island's public highways, and contribute to the
- 12 congestion that strains Maui's transportation infrastructure.
- 13 The legislature believes that it is prudent to target this
- 14 group of highway users to raise revenue for capital improvements
- 15 to Hawaii's highways, which will relieve congestion and improve
- 16 the quality of life for both residents and visitors.

1	The purpose of this Act is to create a pilot project to us		
2	fees from	the rental of motor vehicles leased at certain state	
3	airports	to fund projects to increase highway capacity and	
4	relieve traffic congestion.		
5	Specifically, this Act:		
6	(1)	Creates a user fee of \$4.50 for each day, or portion	
7		of a day, that a rental motor vehicle is rented from a	
8		rental motor vehicle concession located in a medium-	
9		hub airport that serves a county with a resident	
10		population of more than 125,000 but less than 195,000	
11		that includes at least three islands inhabited by	
12		permanent residents; and	
13	(2)	Deposits the fee revenue into the state highway fund;	
14		provided that the revenue shall be used to fund	
15		certain highway capital projects.	
16	SECTION 2. Chapter 261, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
18	and to read as follows:		
19	"§261- Supplemental rental motor vehicle user fee. (a		
20	Subject t	o subsection (d), and in addition to a rental motor	
21	vehicle c	ustomer facility charge authorized by section 261-7(h),	

- 1 the department shall levy, assess, and collect a supplemental
- 2 rental motor vehicle user fee of \$4.50 for each day, or any
- 3 portion of a day, that a rental motor vehicle is rented or
- 4 leased from a rental motor vehicle concession; provided that the
- 5 rental motor vehicle concession is located in a medium-hub
- 6 airport that serves a county with a resident population of more
- 7 than 125,000 but less than 195,000 that includes at least three
- 8 islands inhabited by permanent residents.
- 9 (b) The supplemental rental motor vehicle user fee shall
- 10 be collected by lessors, as defined in section 437D-3, who shall
- 11 pay the charges collected to the department.
- 12 (c) The department shall deposit the revenues collected
- 13 pursuant to this section into the state highway fund established
- 14 pursuant to section 248-8.
- 15 (d) Upon completion of the projects listed in section 248-
- 16 9(c), the director shall cease levying, assessing, and
- 17 collecting the supplemental rental motor vehicle user fee
- 18 established by subsection (a).
- (e) For the purpose of this section, "medium-hub airport"
- 20 means an airport that is classified as a medium-hub airport by

1	the Feder	al Aviation Administration's National Plan of	
2	Integrated Airport Systems."		
3	SECT	ION 3. Section 248-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
4	amended t	o read as follows:	
5	<b>"</b> §24	8-9 State highway fund. (a) Moneys in the state	
6	highway f	und may be expended for the following purposes:	
7	(1)	To pay the costs of operation, maintenance, and repair	
8		of the state highway system, including without	
9		limitation, the cost of equipment and general	
10		administrative overhead;	
11	(2)	To pay the costs of acquisition (including real	
12		property and interests therein), planning, designing,	
13		construction, and reconstruction of the state highway	
14		system and bikeways, including, without limitation,	
15		the cost of equipment and general administrative	
16		overhead;	
17	(3)	To reimburse the general fund for interest on and	
18		principal of general obligation bonds issued to	
19		finance highway projects where the bonds are	
20		designated to be reimbursable out of the state highway	
21		fund; and	

1	(4)	To pay the costs of construction, maintenance, and
2		repair of county roads; provided that none of the
3		funds expended on a county road or program shall be
4		federal funds when such expenditure would cause a
5		violation of federal law or a federal grant agreement
6	(b)	At any time, the director of transportation may
7	transfer	from the state highway fund all or any portion of
8	available	moneys determined by the director of transportation to
9	exceed on	e hundred thirty-five per cent of the requirements for
10	the ensui	ng twelve months for the state highway fund as
11	permitted	by and in accordance with section 37-53. For purposes
12	of the de	termination, the director of transportation shall take
13	into cons	ideration:
14	(1)	The amount of federal funds and bond funds on deposit
15		in, and budgeted to be expended from, the state
16		highway fund during the period;
17	(2)	Amounts on deposit in the state highway fund that are
18		encumbered or otherwise obligated;
19	(3)	Budgeted amounts payable from the state highway fund

during the period;

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1	(4)	Revenues anticipated to be received by and
2		expenditures to be made from the state highway fund
3		during the period based on existing agreements and
4		other information for the ensuing twelve months; and
5	(5)	Any other factors as the director of transportation
6		shall deem appropriate.
7	(c)	Notwithstanding subsections (a) and (b), the
8	departmen	t of transportation shall expend revenues generated
9	from the	supplemental rental motor vehicle user fee deposited
10	into the	state highway fund pursuant to section 261- for the
11	following	projects:
12	(1)	The Paia bypass project; and
13	(2)	The Lahaina bypass project;
14	on the is	land of Maui."
15	SECT	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.

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#### Report Title:

Highways; Rental Motor Vehicle User Charge; Pilot Project

#### Description:

Creates a supplemental rental motor vehicle user fee of \$4.50 per day to be levied, assessed, and collected for rental motor vehicles rented from a rental motor vehicle concession located in any medium-hub airport serving a county that includes at least 3 islands inhabited by permanent residents. Uses revenues to pay for certain highway projects. Requires the Director of Transportation to cease collecting the supplemental rental motor vehicle fee upon completion of the specified highway projects.

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
