15	(3)	The employer of the minor procures and keeps on file a
16		valid certificate of employment[+]; and

1	(4)	With respect to theatrical employment, an on-set child	
2		welfare advocate shall accompany and supervise a minor	
3		whenever the minor is on set and a variance from the	
4		work hour restrictions to allowable theatrical	
5		employment is granted, to ensure employers are

8		this paragraph, "child welfare advocate" means a
