A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMED CONSENT FOR VACCINATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that under the National SECTION 1. 2 Childhood Vaccine Injury Act, all vaccine providers must give 3 patients, or their parents or legal representatives, the 4 appropriate Vaccine Information Statement ("VIS") before each 5 dose of vaccinations are given. These statements provide the 6 consumer with information about the benefits of the vaccine and 7 the risks to adverse reactions. Additionally, if consumers were 8 more informed about the Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System 9 ("VAERS") and the federally funded Vaccine Injury Compensation Program ("VICP"), the State would be able to obtain more 10 11 accurate numbers for possible adverse reactions to vaccines.

12 The legislature also finds that Hawaii statute requires 13 informed consent to be obtained for invasive medical treatments, 14 but currently there is no such provision included in the 15 vaccination laws of the State.

16 The purpose of this Act is to require health care providers17 to obtain written informed consent before administering a



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vaccination and to increase awareness about the possible adverse
 effects of vaccinations.

3 SECTION 2. Section 325-33, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

"§325-33 Performance of vaccination and immunization. (a)
Vaccinations or immunizations required of any person under this
chapter shall be performed by duly licensed physicians or
paramedical personnel under their direction, advanced practice
registered nurses, physician assistants, or by authorized
representatives of the department of health.

11 (b) No person may be vaccinated without informed consent. 12 If the person is a minor or under guardianship, the person's 13 parent or guardian, or the minor if he or she is emancipated, is 14 required to give informed consent on the person's behalf for each vaccination administered. To obtain informed consent under 15 16 this section, a health care provider is required to gather and 17 provide, at a minimum, with ample time to review, the following 18 information: 19 A complete individual and family health history; (1)

20 (2) The vaccine manufacturer's product insert sheet; and



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1	(3) The benefits and risks of each vaccine, including the
2	Vaccine Information Statement provided by the Center
3	for Disease Control, as required under 42 U.S.C.
4	Section 300aa-26.
5	As used in this sub-section, unless the context requires
6	otherwise:
7	"Informed consent" means the written voluntary agreement,
8	given by a person, parent, guardian, or minor, if he or she is
9	emancipated, to receive a vaccination.
10	"Health care provider" means any provider listed under
11	subsection (a).
12	(c) A record of the immunization shall be maintained by
13	the physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice
14	registered nurse and shall be available to the department of
15	education for school entry requirements and the department of
16	health."
17	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
18	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
