A BILL FOR AN ACT

PART I

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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2 The legislature finds that there are nearly SECTION 1. 3 10,000 pesticides registered for use in Hawaii. The department 4 of agriculture is responsible for ensuring pesticides are used correctly in Hawaii. The legislature further finds that it is 5 in the interest of the public to enhance the ability of the 6 7 department of agriculture and the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources to respond to 8 9 questions about pesticide use and make recommendations regarding 10 pesticides for the protection of public safety and the 11 environment. The legislature concludes that this can best be 12 accomplished by increasing the pesticide licensing fee and amending the authorized uses of the pesticide use revolving 13 14 fund.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
(1) Increase the pesticide licensing fee and require
annual renewal of the license;



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1 (2)Amend authorized uses for moneys in the pesticide use 2 revolving fund; 3 (3) Establish an environmental toxicologist position 4 within the department of agriculture and a pesticide 5 extension specialist, through a contract with the 6 department of agriculture, within the University of 7 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human 8 resources; and 9 (4)Appropriate funds out of the pesticide use revolving 10 fund for specific purposes. 11 PART II 12 SECTION 2. Section 149A-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 14 "(b) The licensee shall pay [\$75] \$310 for each year, or fraction thereof, that the pesticide is licensed. Licensing 15 16 fees may be increased or decreased from time to time by rules 17 and may vary according to the amount or quantity of pesticide to 18 be sold, offered for sale, or distributed. [The term of the 19 license shall be for a period of up to three years. A] Every 20 license shall expire on December 31 [of the third] each year. 21 In case of renewal of license, a statement shall be required



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1 only with respect to information which is different from that 2 furnished when the pesticide was licensed or last relicensed." 3 SECTION 3. Section 149A-13.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "§149A-13.5 Pesticide use revolving fund; [pesticide 6 training workshops;] uses; training fee. (a) There is 7 established within the treasury of the State, a pesticide use 8 revolving fund. The fund shall be administered by the 9 department for the purposes of this section. The fund shall 10 consist of: Licensing and registration fees and charges collected 11 (1)12 by the department under section 149A-13(b); 13 (2) All fees collected by the department through the 14 collection of training fees in accordance with 15 subsection (c); and 16 (3) Funds appropriated for the pesticide subsidy program 17 established under Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 18 2014. 19 (b) [Moneys in the pesticide use revolving fund shall be 20 expended by the department to support the pesticide program's 21 registration and licensing, certification and education, and



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5 program created under Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, and

6 other services for pesticide users such as the agricultural pest

7 control industry, the structural pest control industry, and

8 consumer users of pesticides, which provide pesticide

9 instruction in areas including but not limited to the

10 collection, disposal, and recycling of pesticide containers and

11 all other pesticide services deemed necessary by the

12 department.] Moneys from the <u>pesticide use</u> revolving fund may 13 be used for personnel, services, materials, and equipment for 14 the purposes of this section[; provided that the use of moneys 15 from the revolving fund for personnel costs shall be limited to 16 those employees under the registration and education section of 17 the department's pesticides branch]. Moneys in the revolving 18 fund shall be expended by the department for:

19 (1) Registration and technical review;

20 (2) Certification, including certification of restricted

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use pesticides or experimental use pesticides;



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1	(3)	Compliance monitoring activities;
2	(4)	Development of an electronic data collection system
3		for all required pesticide reporting;
4	(5)	Personnel costs, including the hiring of necessary
5		<pre>staff;</pre>
6	(6)	Development of pesticide-related educational materials

8		of tropical agriculture and human resources;
9	(7)	Demonstration trials in conjunction with the
10		University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture
11		and human resources cooperative extension service
12		agents to develop integrated management and drift
13		management technologies; and
14	(8)	A pesticide disposal program.
15	The	department shall also expend revolving fund moneys on
16	the pesti	cide subsidy program created under Act 105, Session
17	Laws of H	awaii 2014, and shall partner with the University of
18	<u>Hawaii co</u>	llege of tropical agriculture and human resources to
19	expend re	volving fund moneys on the establishment of pesticide
20	education	programs and pesticide training programs and for the
21	éstablish	ment of a position of pesticide extension specialist.

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1	[Moneys expended by the department from the pesticide use
2	revolving fund for training workshops, educational programs, and
3	other services for the agricultural pest control industry, the
4	structural pest control industry, and consumer groups shall be
5	expended in a manner that appropriately addresses the needs of
6	each category of pesticide user.]
7	(c) The department may set fees for [the] any educational
8	[services] programs and training programs provided under this
9	section.
10	(d) All interest earned on the deposit or investment of
11	the moneys in the fund shall become a part of the fund.
12	[(e) All unobligated, unencumbered, or unexpended funds
13	remaining in the fund in excess of \$250,000 at the close of each
14	fiscal year shall lapse to the state general fund.
15	(f) (e) The department shall submit an annual report to
16	the legislature on all moneys deposited into, and disbursed
17	from, the pesticide use revolving fund. The report shall be
18	submitted to the legislature not fewer than twenty days prior to
19	the convening of each regular session. The report shall
20	[group]:



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1	(1)	Group all moneys deposited into, and disbursed from,	
2		the revolving fund according to the categories	
3		established in subsections (a) to [(e).] <u>(d);</u>	
4	(2)	Include recommendations to improve pesticide education	
5	·	and regulatory processes within the State; and

8		PART III	
9	SECT	ION 4. (a) The department of agriculture and the	
10	University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human		
11	resources shall execute a memorandum of understanding regarding		
12	the expenditure of moneys from the pesticide use revolving fund		
13	pursuant	to section 149A-13.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes.	
14	(b)	No later than twenty days prior to the regular session	
15	of 2018,	and each regular session thereafter, the department of	
16	agricultu	re and University of Hawaii college of tropical	
17	agriculture and human resources shall submit a report to the		
18	legislature on all moneys expended from the pesticide use		
19	revolving	fund in accordance with the memorandum of	
20	understan	ding required under subsection (a).	

1 SECTION 5. (a) There is established within the department 2 of agriculture the position of an environmental toxicologist. 3 The position shall be exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii Revised 4 Statutes. The position shall partner with the department of 5 health toxicologist to expand the technical capacity of the 6 departments of agriculture and health to analyze findings and 7 make recommendations regarding environmental and human health. 8 (b) There shall be a memorandum of understanding between 9 the department of agriculture environmental toxicologist and the 10 department of health toxicologist that defines a collaborative 11 relationship between the two positions. 12 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use 13 revolving fund the sum of \$200,000 or so much thereof as may be 14 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for 16 operating expenses and the position of environmental 17 toxicologist established under section 5 of this Act. 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 19 of agriculture exclusively for the purposes of this Act. 20 SECTION 7. There is established within the University of 21 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources the



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1 position of pesticide extension specialist, to be funded by the 2 pesticide use revolving fund through a contract with the 3 department of agriculture. The pesticide extension specialist 4 shall be responsible for:

5 (1) Developing educational materials in conjunction with
6 the department of agriculture pursuant to section
7 149A-13.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes;

8 (2) Working with the environmental toxicologist
9 established under section 5 of this Act to design
10 experiments; and

11 (3) Exploring partnerships with other agencies for funding12 opportunities.

SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use revolving fund the sum of \$200,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for operating expenses and the position of a pesticide extension specialist established under section 7 of this Act.

19 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department20 of agriculture exclusively for the purposes of this Act.

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PART IV



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SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use revolving fund the sum of \$25,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for registration and technical review.

6 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use 7 revolving fund the sum of \$25,000 or so much thereof as may be 8 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for 10 certification activities, including certification of restricted 11 use pesticides or experimental use pesticides.

SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use revolving fund the sum of \$300,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for compliance monitoring expenses.

SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use revolving fund the sum of \$750,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the development of an electronic data collection system.



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SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
 revolving fund the sum of \$400,000 or so much thereof as may be
 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much
 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
 development of pesticide-related educational materials.

6 SECTION 14. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use 7 revolving fund the sum of \$300,000 or so much thereof as may be 8 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to conduct 10 demonstration trials in conjunction with the University of 11 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources 12 cooperative extension service agents to develop integrated 13 management and drift management technologies.

14 SECTION 15. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use 15 revolving fund the sum of \$500,000 or so much thereof as may be 16 necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the same sum or so much 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the 18 pesticide disposal program.

SECTION 16. The sums appropriated by sections 9 to 15
shall be expended by the department of agriculture exclusively
for the purposes of this part.

Report Title:

Pesticides; Licensing; Fees; Pesticide Use Revolving Fund; Appropriation

Description:

Increases the pesticide licensing fee and requires annual renewal of the license. Amends authorized uses for moneys in the pesticide use revolving fund. Requires memorandum of understanding between the department of agriculture and the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources regarding the expenditure of funds from the pesticide use revolving fund and a report to the legislature. Establishes an environmental toxicologist position within the department of agriculture and a pesticide extension specialist, through a contract with the department of agriculture, within the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources. Appropriates funds out of the pesticide use revolving fund for specific purposes.
