A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

PART I

2 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that to be successful in 3 the twenty-first century global economy, Hawaii must position 4 itself as a leader in technology development, transfer, and 5 commercialization. Significant progress has been made in past 6 years through programs supported by federal and state 7 initiatives, such as programs administered by the Hawaii 8 technology development corporation, Hawaii strategic development 9 corporation, and the Hawaii technology development venture. 10 However, the legislature believes that additional efforts are 11 required to move Hawaii's technology industry to achieve local 12 technology commercialization. Innovation in science and 13 technology fields will not only enable the State to succeed in 14 the global marketplace, but will also support the State's sustainable economic development goals to include a viable and 15 16 vibrant technology and manufacturing labor force.




