RELATING TO CHILD CARE PROVIDERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 346-157, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

"[+]§346-157[+] Liability insurance coverage; [me]
requirement. (a) For the purpose of this section, "liability
insurance coverage" means a general casualty insurance policy
issued to a provider insuring against legal liability for injury
resulting from negligence to a child during the time the child
is under the care of the child care provider.

9 (b) The department shall [not] require [a provider] all
10 providers to obtain [or] and maintain liability insurance
11 coverage in an amount determined by the department as a
12 condition of licensure, temporary permission, or registration to
13 operate a child care facility.

(c) The department, as a condition of continued licensure,
 temporary permission, or registration, shall require [a provider
 who does not have liability insurance coverage] all providers to



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1	disclose	in writing [that the provider does not have coverage]
2	to each p	arent or guardian:
3	(1)	Applying to have a child cared for at the provider's
4		facility, [if the provider has no] <u>summary information</u>
5		including the insurer's name and contact information,
6		coverage amounts, and effective dates for the
7		provider's liability insurance coverage at the time of
8		application; or
9	(2)	Within seven working days of <u>any change,</u> cancellation <u>,</u>
10		or termination of liability insurance coverage if the
11		coverage is <u>changed</u> , canceled <u>,</u> or terminated while the
12		parent's or guardian's child is cared for at the
13		provider's facility.
14	(d)	The department may suspend or revoke a license,
15	temporary	permit, or certificate of registration of a provider
16	in accord	ance with section 346-164 or 346-175, if [the]:
17	(1)	The provider or any employee of the provider knowingly
18		makes a false statement to any person concerning the
19		provider's liability insurance coverage[+]; or
20	(2)	The provider does not comply with the insurance
21		coverage and disclosure requirements of this section



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1	and rules adopted by the department pursuant to this
2	section.
3	(e) Proof of liability insurance as required by this
4	section shall be verified by the department on an annual basis."
