A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WATER CONSERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. As an island state, Hawaii has limited access
- 2 to natural fresh water. Competition for fresh water, increasing
- 3 population and development pressures, the rising awareness of
- 4 environmental and cultural water needs, and the impacts of
- 5 climate change require that Hawaii become as efficient as
- 6 possible in its uses of limited fresh water supplies. The
- 7 legislature finds that a water conservation program that
- 8 provides financial assistance to county-owned public water
- 9 systems and their customers to help implement water conservation
- 10 measures and practices will reduce water use or waste. County-
- 11 owned public water systems supply approximately two hundred
- 12 million gallons per day or eighty per cent of drinking water in
- 13 Hawaii.
- 14 SECTION 2. There is established within each of the four
- 15 county water supply departments, a two-year water conservation
- 16 financial assistance pilot program to provide financial

- 1 assistance to county-owned public water systems to implement
- 2 their respective water conservation incentive programs.
- 3 As used in this Act:
- 4 "Public water system" has the same meaning as in section
- 5 340E-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 6 "Water conserving technologies" means equipment,
- 7 appliances, and supplies that materially and predictably reduce
- 8 potable water use as determined by the respective county water
- 9 supply department and may include rain barrels and cisterns, hot
- 10 water circulation pumps, soil moisture sensors, smart irrigation
- 11 controllers, turf grass replacement, air conditioning condensate
- 12 capture, multi-unit water sub-meters, WaterSense labeled water
- 13 saving products, high-efficiency toilets, grey-water systems,
- 14 and other devices, apparatus, or materials.
- 15 SECTION 3. To carry out the purposes of this Act, each
- 16 county water supply department shall:
- 17 (1) Administer and manage their water conservation
- 18 incentive programs and document the total estimated
- amount of water conserved under their respective
- 20 program; and

1	(2)	Provide matching runds on a one-to-one cost share
2	·	basis to match state funds appropriated for the
3		purposes of the conservation financial assistance
4		pilot program.
5	SECT	ION 4. A county-owned public water system water
6	conservat	ion incentive program may include:
7	(1)	Rebate programs where county-owned public water
8		systems refund customers no more than fifty per cent
9		of the cost to install water conserving technologies
10		in residential, commercial, institutional, or
11		industrial settings; and
12	(2)	Direct replacement programs where county-owned public
13		water systems pay for the total cost to install water
14		conserving technologies for customers in residential,
15		commercial, institutional, or industrial settings.
16	SECT	ION 5. In order to evaluate the program's
17	17 effectiveness, each county water supply department shall:	
18	(1)	Review its conservation incentive program and
19		determine the amount of non-state matching funds;
20	(2)	Determine the impact, including how funds were used
21		and results of investments, of its water conservation

1	incentive program on water conservation in terms of	
2	water saved; and	
3	(3) Make a recommendation to the legislature on whether	
4	funding for the water conservation financial	
5	assistance program should be expanded, extended, or	
6	discontinued.	
7	Each county water supply department shall submit a report	
8	of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed	
9	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior	
10	to the convening of the regular session of 2019.	
11	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general	
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much	
13	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the	
14	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year	
15	2018-2019 for the two-year water conservation financial	
16	assistance pilot program; provided that:	
17	(1) The appropriation shall be disbursed equally to each	
18	county; and	
19	(2) No funds shall be disbursed to a county unless matched	
20	by that county on a dollar-for-dollar basis.	

- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by each of the four
- 2 county water supply departments for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2099, and
- 4 shall be repealed on June 30, 2019.
