## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONERS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is estimated that
- 2 one in five hundred children in the State are born with
- 3 orofacial anomalies such as cleft lip or cleft palate. The
- 4 legislature further finds that orthodontic services, such as
- 5 reconstructive surgery, can assist individuals with orofacial
- 6 anomalies by addressing functional deficiencies in chewing,
- 7 swallowing, respiration, and speech, as well as unstable or
- 8 malpositioned oral structures, premature tooth loss, and other
- 9 health problems. In response to individuals and families who
- 10 lacked access to orthodontic treatment of orofacial anomalies,
- 11 Act 213, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015 (Act 213), was enacted to
- 12 require health insurance coverage of medically necessary
- 13 orthodontic services for the treatment of certain orofacial
- 14 anomalies. Under the definition of "orthodontic services" in
- 15 Act 213, the services are required to be provided by a licensed
- 16 dentist with a certification in orthodontics by the American
- 17 Board of Orthodontics (ABO).

- 1 However, the legislature notes that of the approximately
- 2 forty orthodontists in the State, only eleven are certified by
- 3 the ABO. Furthermore, of the eleven orthodontists with an ABO
- 4 certification, only a few have performed the medically necessary
- 5 orthodontic services for treatment of orofacial anomalies
- 6 described in sections 431:10A-132 and 432:1-613, Hawaii Revised
- 7 Statutes, and only in limited circumstances. The legislature
- 8 also notes that a certification by the ABO is voluntary and not
- 9 required to practice orthodontics in the State.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to expand the pool of
- 11 orthodontists who are eligible to perform orthodontic services
- 12 for treatment of orofacial anomalies, covered by health
- 13 insurance, to any licensed dentist who has completed an
- 14 orthodontic residency program.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 431:10A-132, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 16 is amended by amending subsection (h) to read as follows:
- 17 "(h) As used in this section, unless the context clearly
- 18 requires otherwise:
- 19 "Orofacial anomalies" means cleft lip or cleft palate and
- 20 other birth defects of the mouth and face affecting functions
- 21 such as eating, chewing, speech, and respiration.

- 1 "Orthodontic services" mean direct or consultative services
- 2 provided by a licensed dentist [with a certification in
- 3 orthodontics by the American Board of Orthodontics.] who has
- 4 completed an orthodontic residency program accredited by the
- 5 Commission on Dental Accreditation.
- 6 "Treatment of orofacial anomalies" includes the care
- 7 prescribed, provided, or ordered for an individual diagnosed
- 8 with an orofacial anomaly by a craniofacial team that includes a
- 9 licensed dentist, orthodontist, oral surgeon, and physician, and
- 10 is coordinated between specialists and providers."
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 432:1-613, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:
- "(q) As used in this section, unless the context clearly
- 14 requires otherwise:
- 15 "Orofacial anomalies" means cleft lip or cleft palate and
- 16 other birth defects of the mouth and face affecting functions
- 17 such as eating, chewing, speech, and respiration.
- 18 "Orthodontic services" means direct or consultative
- 19 services provided by a licensed dentist [with a certification in
- 20 orthodontics by the American Board of Orthodontics.] who has

- 1 completed an orthodontic residency program accredited by the
- 2 Commission on Dental Accreditation.
- 3 "Treatment of orofacial anomalies" includes the care
- 4 prescribed, provided, or ordered for an individual diagnosed
- 5 with an orofacial anomaly by a craniofacial team that includes a
- 6 licensed dentist, orthodontist, oral surgeon, and physician, and
- 7 is coordinated between specialists and providers."
- 8 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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## Report Title:

Health Care Practitioners; Orthodontic Services; Orofacial Anomalies; Health Insurance; Coverage Services

## Description:

Expands the pool of orthodontists who are eligible to perform medically necessary orthodontic services for treatment of certain orofacial anomalies for which health insurance coverage is mandatory. (SD1)

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
